I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 16th February, concerning #3893 Pte. George Haliburton. With reference to your remarks about the non-receipt of parcels, I would say that several letters have been received stating that parcels and letters forwarded during November and December had not been received for six or seven weeks after posting. It is believed that a large portion of Newfoundland mail became sidetracked in St. John N.B. and was delayed in being forwarded to the United Kingdom. That of course is a matter over which this department has no control.

I would state for your information that the practice which obtains at present concerning casualties with the second battalion is, that they are not reported officially except in cases of serious or dangerous illness. The matter of having all casualties reported is under the consideration of the Minister at present.

We have two boys doing their bit for King & Country but the other chap is in the Navy, and has had no trouble getting letters & etc.
