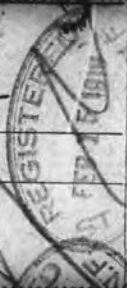

I beg to inform you that the late Pte. Hall was buried, with full military honours, at Brookwood Cemetery on 7/11/18. There was unfortunately a delay in the burial, due to the fact that it was difficult to secure a coffin, owing to the large number of fatalities resulting from pneumonia in the London area at the present time. The Firing Party consisted of Soldiers from the London Rifle Brigade, which also sent its Regimental Band. The service was conducted by the Rev. Stanley Mason, C.F.. The coffin was covered with the Union Jack. Pte. Hall was buried in Grave No. 182000, Newfoundland plot.

A wreath from from the Newfoundland War Contingent Association was laid upon the coffin.

Amongst those who attended at the grave side, Corporal L. Fallon, of the P.&R.O. Staff, London, represented the Royal Newfoundland Regt.

The last post was sounded at 2.15 p.m.

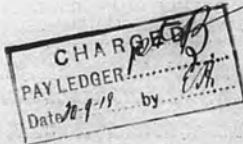
