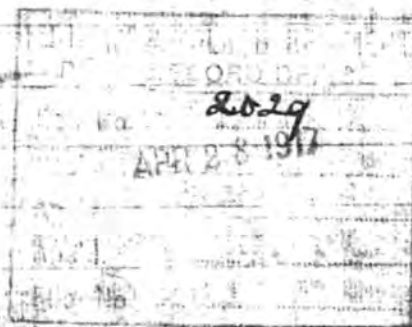

With reference to your letter of 14/10/16, relating to the parcel which you addressed to No. 844 Pte. F.Hallett, of the 1st Newfoundland Regt., I beg to state: ~~_____~~

1. The parcel passed through this Office and was delivered with the regimental mail at the front.
2. When the parcel reached the Regiment the addressee had apparently been evacuated to hospital. No report has been received at this Office stating what hospital he was admitted to. If the parcel had been returned here it would have been held until the correct address was known.
3. The Parcel was returned to you, not by this Office, but by the London Post Office, to whom you should write. The responsibility of this Office ceased when the parcel, which was correctly re-addressed at the time, was sent to the Expeditionary Force.
4. In reply to your question "is it any good sending parcels, etc" I beg to suggest that it is; out of many millions which are handled by the Army Post Office in the course of a year, very few, proportionately, go astray. It is unfortunate that your' should have been one of the very few.
5. In addressing a private it is customary and advisable to put the name of the regiment he is in.

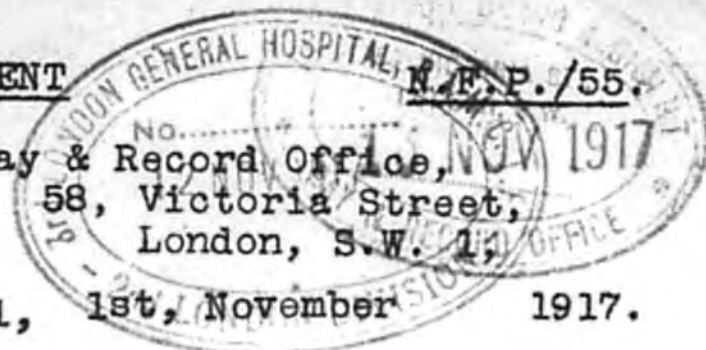


