

Sir,

I beg to submit report re transport of reinforcements draft leaving St. John's 22-10-18.

Everything went well up to embarking at Quebec, no doubt Major Paterson, A.D.M.S., has made satisfactory report.

The epidemic commenced while we were going down the river, my men were fortunately occupying the No. 1, Lower Troop deck, forward, and our parade deck, was the Forecastle Deck, and thus away from the major portion of troops, we drew rations from the forecastle cook house, the men kept well until we got clear of the Straits of Belle Isle, then some of them became sea sick and could not be prevailed upon to eat, they naturally became weak, and by this time the influenza got more prevalent and spread all over the ship, great care and attention was taken to keeping their quarters well scrubbed and clean, making free use of disinfectants and I insisted on the men staying on deck, except in case of those who were too weak and had to remain in hammocks (M.O.'s orders).

5859 Pte. L. Hynes, was the first case to go to Hospital, this man had become very weak from sea sickness and was in poor condition when admitted, although he fought hard to combat the disease.

5741 Pte. C. McCarthy, did not complain till about 10.30 p.m. 7-10-18, when I had him paraded to Hospital and admitted, he walked with assistance.

5950 Pte. J. Boucher, was in Hospital a few days, all these cases were well cared for, and every attention possible was being done to save the troops,

I was present at the burial at sea of the three men. There were 14 men in Hospital till we reached an English Port and 502 Sgt. E. Joy, sick in his quarters, they were all landed as stretcher cases, some of them were serious and I have been informed of the death of five.

Sergt. Joy, up to going sick had paid great attention to the comfort of the men, and there is no doubt that he became a casualty from devotion to duty and performance of same.

I wish to make special report and bring to your notice 79 Sgt. A Hammond, M.M. R.A.M.C. who had to perform the duties of Hospital Sergeant Major.

Sergeant Hammond worked hard day and night in performance of his duties, not only with our own men but with all the hundreds that reported to the M.O. daily and large numbers in different wards, by the end of the first week every available space on board had been turned to Hospital use. Sergt. Hammond sat up four nights with Sergt. Joy and attended to his needs. I had arranged for special diet to be served during the night and it was difficult at times to obtain necessary nourishments, as you may imagine on board of a transport even when sickness is prevalent.

I wish also to bring to your attention, Capt. H.S. Tait, C.A.M.C. who was proceeding overseas he took a great interest in my men, Capt. Tait had charge of one ward 2 of our men were in his ward and both have done well, they were serious cases when admitted he also visited the different wards where my men were and also Sergt. Joy in his stateroom, it was gratifying to hear Capt. Tait at times when asking about certain men, "they are out of danger", I am enclosing copies of death certificates, unofficial, supplied me by Capt. Tait.

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of file  
M-9-15-18 asking for report:-

(1) Re attachment of Newfoundlander ~~in~~ *in Medical Office*  
in Imperial Service to Second Battalion

This has been (I have heard unofficially) granted  
in response to my letter to Director General, Army  
Medical Services, M-9-15-16 of December 28th., 1917, of  
which copy is attached, which letter was written without  
any knowledge of the correspondence on the same subject  
which took place in April 1917, when the transfer was  
refused. This letter to the Director-General will  
show you just how our Contingent stands in connection  
with the Army Medical Services.

(2) Re attachment of Medical Officer to  
Pay & Record Office, London.

I take it that the moving of Second Battalion from  
Scotland to Winchester, and the attaching of a Newfound-  
lander as Medical Officer, removes, to a large extent, the  
reasons advanced for the attachment of a Medical Officer  
to the Pay & Record Office.

The need of medical men is so great at the present  
time that it would not be advisable, in my opinion, for  
the detailing of a Medical Officer for this work, which  
would be largely of a clerical nature.

As our men in England are under the same medical  
care as the Imperial troops provision is made for them

wherever they happen to be.

I quite see the advisability, however, of attaching someone to the Pay & Record Office who could look up men who happen to get in out of the way Hospitals, and provide for their removal to the Depot when ready for repatriation. In this way parties of men for repatriation could be made up at the Depot and sent home in the care of returning Officers, or in the care of the Officer suggested hereunder.

For such service we have a man who, in my opinion, would be most suitable, viz: 79 Sergeant A. Hammond of the Medical Department of our Regiment. This man has been through the fighting from the very start, with no let up. I think he will show <sup>a record of</sup> more days in the trenches than any other man in the Regiment.

I recommend that he be commissioned as Lieutenant and attached to the Pay & Record Office for the duties above outlined, and I feel sure that this arrangement will give the greatest satisfaction and efficiency.

Sir:-

I have the honour to refer to conversation which I had with you in April 1915 and in October 1916 with reference to arrangements with regard to the Newfoundland Medical Services.

May I call to your mind that the question was then discussed as to whether Newfoundland should equip a hospital unit of some sort to undertake the care of all Newfoundland sick and wounded.

At the first interview I had the honour to inform you that Newfoundland had sent overseas one Regiment, and contemplated sending many medical men, trained nurses and V. A. D's and supporting through the St. John Ambulance Association a number of Hospital beds.

In April 1915 you expressed the opinion that it would be difficult to arrange a hospital unit to attend to the needs of but one Regiment, and to do the needed for them in all stages: wounded, sick, special treatment and convalescence. You also pointed out the advantages of falling in with the general scheme of treatment of the army, with its great General Hospitals, eminent Specialists, &c. You advised that if we fell in with this advice all medical details coming over should enlist direct into the Royal Army Medical Corps, Queen Alexandra's Imperial Military Nursing Service Reserve and Joint Voluntary Aid Department of the

**Order of St. John and British Red Cross.**

You were kind enough to promise further that should we wish to nominate any of these Officers for service with the Newfoundland Regiment as Regimental Medical Officer you would have him so appointed.

In interview of October 1916 the whole question was reopened when I reported to you the number of details we had sent over. I again had questions asked from Newfoundland re the formation of a Newfoundland Hospital for treatment of the Newfoundland Regiment but had had sufficient experience in the field to realize the impracticability of such a scheme.

You were kind enough to again weigh the matter carefully and concluded that it would be best for us to continue as heretofore.

I again mentioned the matter of our possibly wishing to nominate an Officer for duty with the Regiment, and you again told me it could be arranged.

I have taken the liberty of outlining these conversations, as nothing was put in writing on the matter.

An Army Council Instruction was, however, issued on the matter ordering the treatment of men of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment to be undertaken in the same manner as that of Imperial Troops.

I regret having no copy of Army Council Instruction I am unable to supply reference number of this Instruction but I think it is 1656 of 24/8/16.

It has been found desirable that one of our Newfoundland Doctors should hold the post of Medical Officer, Second Battalion, Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

I have been instructed by the Minister of Militia, Newfoundland, to nominate for this post:-

Capt. James St. Pierre Knight,  
R. A. M. C.

There has been no fault whatever found with the present incumbent. Our only trouble has been the frequent

changing of Officers as there are certain duties differing from those with other regiments, which concern the repatriation of invalided soldiers.

I trust that the nomination now forwarded will meet with your approval.

Sir:-

I have the honour to call to your attention the special report made on the marginally noted man by Captain J. Nunns, Officer conducting draft leaving here on the 22nd of October.

These few words of Captain Nunns show that Sergeant Hammond showed very particular devotion to duty on the trip.

It should be noted that Sergeant Hammond was on leave when this draft sailed and he offered to accompany it, thus foregoing leave which would have extended beyond the cessation of hostilities.

Sergeant Hammond has from the very beginning of our Regiment showed this same devotion to duty. An examination into records will, I feel certain, show more trench duty to Sergeant Hammond's credit than perhaps any other man in the Regiment.

I have already recommended to you - April 29th., 1918 - that Sergeant Hammond be given a commission in order that he may act in connection with the Pay & Record Office in the matter of repatriation of disabled soldiers. Unfortunately there are certain difficulties in the way of this, as our forces being a line Regiment, Sergeant Hammond in order to obtain a commission would have to go through an Officers' training corps. As his duties have been wholly medical such a course would probably be out of the question for him.



In the meantime, I strongly recommend that he be given the highest Warrant Rank, and that I be given permission to call to the attention of the Director General Medical Services of the War Office his devotion to duty.

I attach Captain Nunne's report, and the other correspondence, also personal letter from Sergeant Hammond to me. When the case has been dealt with will you kindly return personal letter and pass remaining correspondence for file.
