

Sir:- 2805, the late Pte. G. Hann.

I have the honour to state that the late Pte. George Hann, of the 1st Newfoundland Regiment, was buried with full military honours at Brookwood Cemetery on the 13/9/17.

The firing and bugle party consisted of men from the 4th London Rifle Brigade.

The coffin was covered with the Newfoundland flag.

Private Hann was interred in Grave No. 179758, Newfoundland plot.

The inscription on the coffin was: 2805 Pte. George Hann, 1st Newfoundland Regiment, Died 8th September, Aged 20 years.

A wreath of Ferns, Lilies, and Roses was sent by the Nursing Staff of the 4th London General Hospital: another of Laurel Leaves and Dahlias from Mrs. E. Roberts, who visited Pte. Hann during his illness: another from the Newfoundland War Contingent Association.

Amongst others who attended at the grave side was 1218, Corporal T.M. Hussey, representing the Pay & Record Office.

The Last Post was sounded and a volley of three rounds blank was fired at 1.35 p.m.

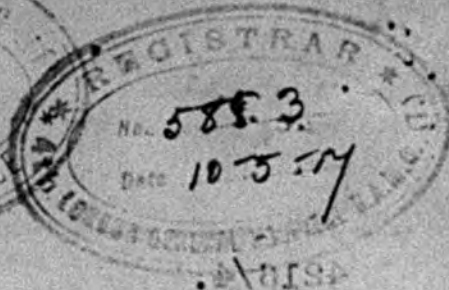


