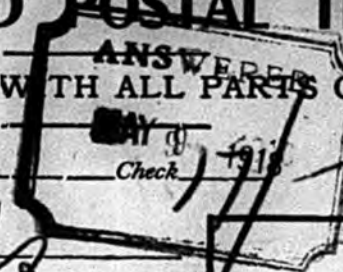

NOTES.—(i.) 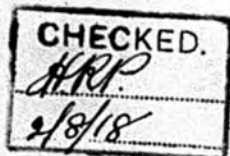
