Pte. Harris was arrested at Morestead, Hants, on 16/5/19. He was convicted of misdemeanour at Winchester Court of Assizes, and sentenced to three months imprisonment, 2nd Division, in H.M. Prison, Winchester. The date of the expiration of his sentence is given as 2/a.m. on 16/9/19, and the earliest possible date of discharge is given as 1/9/19. As yet we have received no word from the other side that Pte. Harris has been discharged. Upon receipt of any such information I shall communicate further with you.
