An Afternoon With Newfoundland Wounded,

by

A. Stanley Harvey.

It was both an honour and a pleasure to be among our wounded on the afternoon of December 14 at a Xmas Tea and entertainment given in their honour in the spacious rooms of the Lyceum, Picadilly, London. The entertainment was organised by Miss Goodridge of St. John's, assisted by the ladies of the club. Miss Goodridge is well known by all our wounded for her untiring efforts to give them a good time whenever possible, and yesterday's afternoon's fete was proof of her splendid capabilities in this direction. An invitation had been sent to the Pay & Record Office for a representative, and I was lucky enough to be "told off". When I arrived about 3.45 I found the boys, in their familiar hospital blue, seated around tables loaded with all kinds of good things, in one of the largest of the reception rooms of the Club. All wore a happy contented smile, and were chatting away in the good old Newfoundland fashion. Some had bandages around their hands, and on their heads, others had arms in slings, a few had crutches by their chairs, and one or two had bandages over their eyes. It was a picture not without its deep pathos, but any feeling of sorrow which might have crept into the heart of a spectator would have been instantly banished by this vivid proof of the wonderful courage, unsurpassed bravery, and undeniable patriotism with which these men, these wounded heroes and our countrymen, charged into the hell of the 1st July fire to be mowed down like sheep, broken, bleeding, and torn, and were again able to withstand the fierce attack of October 12, and bring it to such a glorious conclusion. Amongst the maimed warriors I quickly found several who had gone through the horrors of the Dardanelles Campaign with me, and we were soon talking of old times. Presently the ladies started bringing the tea around, and I feel sure no Masonic Tea Party on St. Patrick's day could ~~have~~ boasted of a more animated healthy scene, or a quicker disappearance of good things. The groaning tables were given no rest, for as soon as they became light they were quickly filled again. Sandwiches, cakes, tea-buns, light cake and dark cake, apples, bananas, oranges, grapes, figs, and dates, all met the same fate, and all went



the same way home. Several chaps had only the use of one arm, but ladies were allotted to each table to look out for those, and they were well seen to and looked after. Xmas bon-bons and crackers were much in evidence, and much to the amusement of the ladies each wounded warrior immediately placed his paper hat, found in the bon-bon, upon his head. Tin whistles and horns were found also, and a perfect shrieking of whistles followed. Laughter, paper hats and whistles reigned and won the day. After the "boys" had finished tea, cigarettes were passed round and a splendid programme was gone through.

The concert was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone. The singing of Mrs. Carlyle-Gall was excellent. Her pure, vivacious voice charmed the chaps; her singing of "Keep the Home fires burning" was hailed with delight, and she was well supported in the chorus by the lads.

The dancing of Miss Phipps pupils was a perfect treat. Miss Phipps is a teacher of high order, and her pupils by their gracefulness of limb and movement of body testify to her excellent teaching. Mrs. Simpler's droll recitation put the chaps in the best of humour, and their shrieks of laughter were good to hear. The splendid rendering by Mr. C.V. Jacobs of Robert Service's "The shooting of dangerous Dan McGraw" held them spell-bound, and he was encored again and again. The performers were in splendid form, and they responded the encores gladly. After the concert presents were given out. Each chap drew a number and was given the corresponding numbered present. The presents were good and suitable and consisted of pipes, cigarettes, cigars, cigarette-holders, cigar-holders, cigarette cases, pocket books, vallets, match-boxes, in fact everything that the heart of a soldier could wish for. I understand Miss Goodridge and one of the ladies of the Club donated the presents. The boys gave Miss ~~Ethel~~ <sup>G.</sup> Ethel hearty thanks for her kindness. After "God save the King" had been sung. I moved a vote of thanks on behalf of the Newfoundlanders, to the ladies

of the Lyceum Club, and in doing so praised the kind treatment which had been meted out to us everywhere a Newfoundlander had gone. One of the most prominent ladies responded and said it was a great honour to have Newfoundlanders there, and that the thanks were on their side, and they thanked us for coming. She and all English people were proud of Newfoundland, and of the noble part she had taken in this terrible war. Brighter times would be coming, and that when they did come Newfoundland's glorious share would never be forgotten. She wished the wounded a speedy recovery to health and ~~at~~ and strength. At 6.15 the buses and motors were announced and the chaps went back to the 3rd London General Hospital perfectly delighted with the change from hospital. Three good hearty cheers were given for the Lyceum Club and the boys it a splendid afternoon. I understand this is not the first time the Club has opened its doors to Newfoundland troops; and I know it will not be the last. I tried to get as many names as possible of those that were there, as I know how these entertainments interest the parents and public at home. Every mother would naturally ~~wish~~ hope her son had had such a good time. Thirty seven wounded were at the entertainment, and I ~~had~~ thirty names as follows.




