I have examined Mr. E. Hatcher, who was sent to me by the G.W.V.A. I have taken this man's history and he denies all knowledge of V.D.S. On examination both eyes show pupils fixed, irregular outline and they do not dilate with atropine. Examination of the fundus shows extensive choroiditis and retinitis both eyes. There is also a marked optic atrophy present.

This man states there is a piece of shrapnel still in his head, he also feels pain from same. His records show previous blood examinations positive, however, there is nothing in his history to show that he suffered from V.D.S. whilst in the Army; of course there is a possibility that the condition may have existed prior to service or developed since discharge.

I do not think that there is anything to suggest in the way of treatment to alleviate this man's condition.
