MRS. DOROTHY HAYMES (27) visited the local office with her two children, and saked if the Society could help her by inducing her husband, ROMENT HAYMES, RELLISTAND, HAST WARMA, HEMPOUNDLAND; to contribute towards their support. The man's proper name is PARSONES, his mother having died when he was a baby, some people named Haynes adopted him and he took that name)

Mrs. Haynes is at present acting as Cook to a Mrs. Butterworth of Camberley, at a salary of 236. - a year, out of which she has to pay her mother and father, Mr. & Mrs. Richens, 21 Chester Street, Reading, 10/- per week for the children.

After her marriage, Mrs. Haynes stated she went to Canada, but circumstances compelled her to return to England which she did on the 22nd May 1921. It was agreed that her husband should follow. Six weeks attee her arrival in England, her husband came to see her at Reading, but only remained one night, as he was a stoker on a ship plying between London and Canada, and was leaving the next day. Before leaving, he promised to send some money towards the maintenance of the children, but has not done so. The wife wrote several latter to him, and the first raply received from him was on the 4th Aug. 22 (capy attached). This latter was answered, and the raply received on the 3rd Jan. 3. In these days the sum is not more than would enable a woman to maintain herself and bring up two children respectably; and as the Society's Inspector at Reading reports that she is not at present earning any money I hope it will be possible that smething in the nature of an adequate contstution may be obtained from the husband, although, of course, she could exist on a less sum than that maximum.





This is a very difficult case to deal with the disability is a very serious one and likely to be progressive.

The pensioner has severe pain at times and as a result is very difficult to menage. He is living in a small house in country 5 miles from Aylesbury.

On the occasion of my visit to him on 9.1.27. he was having severe pain owing to a temporary block in the surrapuble tube.

According to the M.P.M.S.D.28 his accepted disability is "Seminal Vesiculitis". T.B. Prostate, seminal vesicles, bladder and probably kidneys." The present condition is entirely due to this. The suprapuble drainage of bladder was done in Royal Bucks Hospital, Aylesbury, in November, 1928.

The pensioner is very averse to going into hospital again at present and as no further operative treatment is indicated, it is suggested that he remain under the care of the Local General Medical Fractitioner and that an attendant to assist him be provided as suggested in the message from the Newfoundland Authorities 28:12.28.

A letter from Dr. Taylor of Aylesbury, who is attending him, is attached and no doubt he could find a local man suitable and willing to assist the pensioner. M.P.W.S.D.28 is attached also.

As suggested by you I am furnishing a short report as to Haynes present condition and outlook.

His general condition is fair only, although he is not running any temperature.

Locally his suprapubic wound has now practically healed and he has a good drainage from it. His wrine contains pus and large quantities of thick ? glacry mucous which is often difficult to clear away.

Around his perineus and rectum are multiple sinuses which often get blocked and fill-up with a similar mucus and until they are relieved he suffers a good deal of pain. ? Haynes has recently had some trouble with his suprapuble drainage. I arranged to take him into one of my beds at the Royal Bucks Hospital and he was secordingly admitted at six 0:clock. Three hours later after disturbing the peaceful atmosphere he insisted on returning home.

To-day at great inconvenience to myself and another doctor who administered the anaesthetic for me, we at his home re-opened his suprapuble wound and put his tube into his bladder again etc.

I have just come in from seeing him again - he has pulled out the tube and generally undone two hours work.

I must say I am very sorry for Haynes - he is a very ill man and has some very likeable characteristics.

I have given him a great deal of time and care, although he would only partially carry out his treatment.

I most certainly do not feel that any further surgical treatment would be of any axel. The only thing left is to relieve his pain, but I would suggest and very strongly so that permanent hospital treatment would be by far the best thing for him.

He has, I can assure you, been a real source

of trouble and anxiety to the whole village.

I trust that you will see your way to follow out my suggestion.




