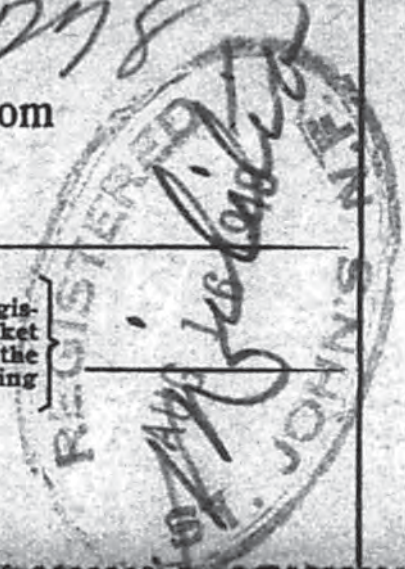

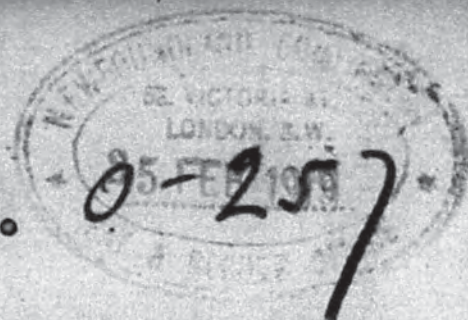

I beg to quote hereunder the details for which your son #1974 Sergeant. William Haynes of the Royal Newfoundland Regiment, was awarded the DISTINGUISHED CONDUCT MEDAL. Taken from supplement to the LONDON GAZETTE.

"For conspicuous bravery and devotion to duty. On the 13th. April 1918, while in command of a platoon, the enemy attacked in strength and forced a gap on the left flank of the battalion. Under very heavy fire he led his platoon to a counter attack, re-organised the line, and held it against further attacks"
