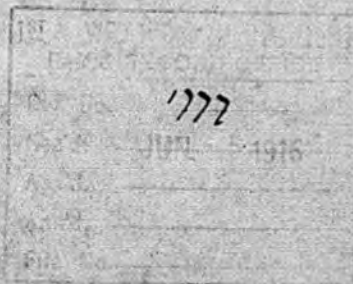

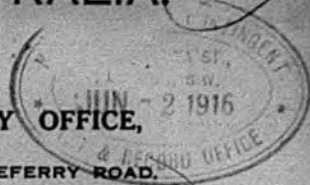

from 1917 - 1918 = 8008 = 10/11/17

If I had to know as in this case I would
be treated like this I never would have allowed
him to enlist, He has done more for the
Regiment than many others, in the first place
he induced all his comrades to join it for
the Army and one for the Navy and is
still asking every boy he knows to enlist
to keep up the Honour of the Regiment and
made himself 2 yrs older to Pass, he
has gone through it all since he joined in
