Dear Sir:

I have the honour, by direction, to acknowledge receipt of your letter of December 28th, 1918, in which you make inquiries re the above named member of The Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

For your information, I may say that Pte. Healy was taken prisoner on April 14th 1917. On December 4th he arrived in London as a released Prisoner of War in good health and immediately went on leave, which leave, no doubt, is still unexpired. It is <sup>probable</sup> quite possible that in the near future he will be returning to St. John's, Newfoundland, as quite a number of released Prisoners have already arrived, and an effort is being made to repatriate the others with as little delay as possible.

Our records show his Next of Kin as James Healy, father, Grand Falls, Newfoundland, and it is to him, of course, that we have addressed all notices with regard to Pte. Healy. But upon the latter's arrival here we shall communicate direct with Miss Healy at the address as given in your letter.

We were called upon some time ago on behalf of Miss Frances Healy, 619 Center Street, Chicago, Illinois, to locate, if possible, her brother, Philip Healy. We referred the case to the Canadian Patriotic Fund, Ottawa, Ontario, who advise us to take up this matter with your organization.

The information we have is as follows: Miss Healy received a postcard dated June 16th, 1918, from her brother who was at that time a prisoner of war #2191 at Munster, Westphalia, Camp III, Prison Section (Gefangenenlagen) 3. The only other information we have is that he was a member of the Newfoundland Regiment.

If you can give us any information concerning this man, you will relieve Miss Healy's anxiety.



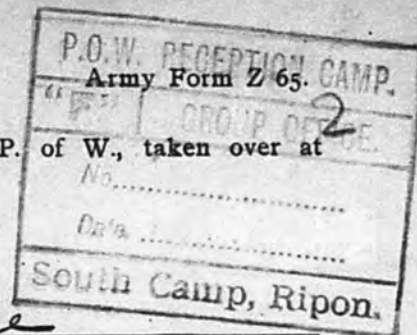
