**OPINION OF THE MEDICAL BOARD.**

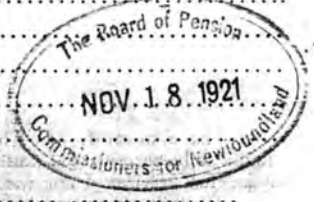

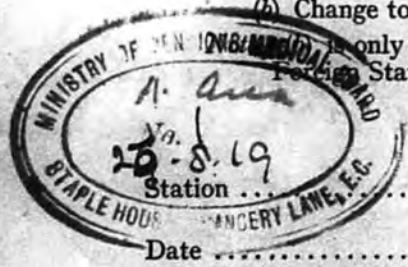

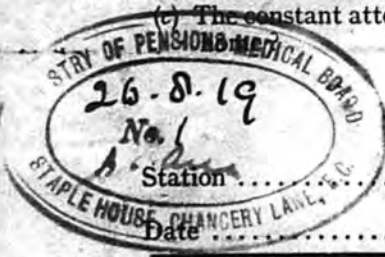
