STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR.

#1666, Ex. Pts. Heath - Botwood, N.D.B.

Date of enlistment - 17th June 1915. Proceeded Overseas about Nov. 5th/1915.

Company in France - "G" Company -

Date & Place of Capture - Arras, Viny Ridge, 14th April 1917.

Details of Life & Treatment while under Capture: First three treated very bad lying upon floor of concrete, without covering, no roof, enclosed with barbed wire, go to work at daylight and work until dark digging sunken roads. If refusing to work you would be shot. I was feeling sick one day and asked the German Sergt. Major to let me off. I lay down for about 1/2 hour, when one of the Prussian Guards came along and asked me to go to work, I told him that I had asked the Sergt. Major to let me off but he did not heed it and beat me with a rifle. I was then taken to hospital, where I had to live upon potato peelings, this was behind the lines. I was taken back to Germany and worked in an Iron & Steel Foundry I had to work from six in the morning until six in the evening including Sundays, with very little food until the Armistice was signed, when we were taken back to the prison camp, from there sent to Holland, thence to England.

Circumstances of Capture:- We advanced to our Objective on the 14th, April, 1917 and the Germans smashed through our left flank, I was using a Machine Gun until I had all my ammunition used and was sent back by Lieutenant Gardener to get another supply of same, and while going back the Germans surrounded me, ordering me to put up my hands, but I proceeded on until one of the Germans hit me with the stock of his rifle striking me upon the back of my head, when I fell headlong I got up again and tried to defend myself with the bayonet, but they were too many for me. I was taken back with two other of our boys, and put in Douai prison for 11 days.


