Enlisted at St. John's on Nov. 16th. 1916. Sailed from
St. John's Jan. 31st. Arrived at Windsor Feb. 3rd. 1917.

This man reported on sick parade as suffering from pains in legs and feet and stated that he was unable to do any route marching. On enquiry this man stated that he had been in the General Hospital in St. John's for a period of 18 months undergoing treatment for Beri-Beri. Patient claims that he is still suffering from the effects of this disease and on examination I am of opinion that such is the case. I am of opinion that this man is not likely to become an efficient soldier and would recommend that he be returned to Headquarters for discharge. I am of opinion that disability is not the result of ordinary Military Service nor has it been aggravated thereby.
