Herder's death.

With reference to your letter of 27/9/15, I understand there would be no difficulty with regard to your drawing through the Anglo-Egyptian Bank, subject of course to condition of your account with the Bank of Montreal, London. In order to protect your credit there I have guaranteed upwards of £5/0, but as notified to the Adjutant for information of the Officers of the 1st. Battalion prior to its departure, and also by confirmatory communications afterwards posted, no further payments are to be made to the banking accounts in this country of Officers on active service, as they draw pay through the Adjutant who draws necessary funds on imprest through the A.P.D.

All this has been very carefully explained, and should have been, and I understand was communicated to the Officers. Obviously it is not practicable for Officers to draw pay from two sources.

As you will recollect I deposited certain advances prior to departure of the Battalion, and before close of Pay Period.

For your better information I enclose copy of your account to period ended 1/10/15.
