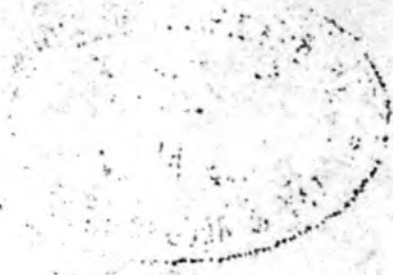

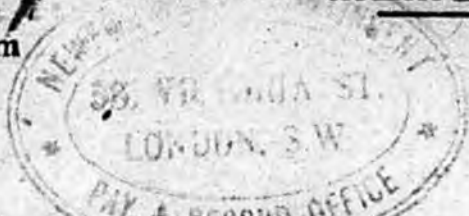

I feel sure you will see the soundness of this position, and I can only say that it would be a pleasure to me to do what I could in such a case as Pte. Hickey's, if my powers were absolute in relation thereto.

I am now Sir going to request you to again interest yourself in his behalf by trying to keep him at home. He has already done his duty in this cruel War, and as he is the only support of a widowed mother and two sisters, I think his case is worthy of consideration.

To His Excellency the Governor.

May it please Your Excellency:

In this morning's "News" I have read the letter from Your Excellency to Private Murphy, in which Your Excellency says that you and your Ministers have decided not to ask for further leave of absence for the Blue Puttees, but that you would be pleased to consider any case of special hardship.

I felt that Your Excellency would not consider it an offence on my part if I wrote you with respect to my boy. His name is James Joseph Hickey, No. 115. He is a private. As his number shows, he was one of the very first to volunteer. He left Newfoundland on the 4th of October, 1914. After training in England he was in Egypt and the Dardenelles and then in France. After fifteen months' service he had ten days' leave of absence, after another eighteen months' service he had fourteen days' leave. He has now been home since the 4th of August. When he volunteered my husband was living. He died in February, 1915. I have for some time past been very ill. I am about sixty-~~four~~<sup>8</sup> years of age and too ill to leave my house to go down town. I have only three children, two daughters, neither of whom is married, and this boy. One of my daughters has to stay home with me to look after me in the house. The other earns enough as a tailoress to feed and clothe herself. This boy is my



only boy. He is now twenty-eight years of age. He has been a good boy to me and has been giving me eighty cents a day out of his \$1.10.

I respectfully ask Your Excellency to give consideration to this very hard case and not ask me in my illness to send my boy away from me for a fifth winter when there are so many thousands of men of military fitness who, I am sure, are quite ready to give one year to the service of King and Country where my boy has given four. If I did not feel that his place could be filled many times over I would be ready for the further great sacrifice of letting him again go to France, but I feel that Your Excellency can sympathise with me in my great distress and grant my boy leave of absence until the spring of the year.
