\*1253 Substantive Promotion of Second Lieut.

It has been decided that all Second Lieut. Lieutenants, if duly recommended, shall be eligible for promotion to the rank of Lieutenant on completion of 18 months commissioned service, if they have not previously been promoted to fill a vacancy.

C.O's should at once submit the names of all Lieutenants who have already completed the qualifying period laid down above, provided their promotion is recommended. It will rest with the C.O's to take similar action in the case of Lieutenants who complete 18 months service in future\*.

Further I would like to suggest that such promotions from second Lieutenant to Lieutenant be automatically made at Headquarters in accordance with this procedure, both in this and the 1st Battalion.
