Opinion of the Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as, in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

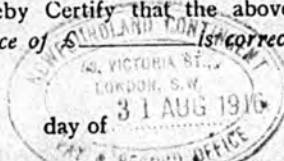

Sir,

I regret to report that No.1415-Pte. Michael Hickey, F. Coy., 1st Newfoundland Regiment, who was admitted to this hospital on 22-12-15, has developed mental symptoms which have necessitated his removal to an asylum.

On admission he was suffering from an affection of the ear and on 18-1-16 was transferred to one of our auxiliary hospitals. On 24-1-16 he was sent back to this hospital as he was very excitable and his manner peculiar. On that date we sent him to an observation ward after Headquarters authority had been obtained. Yesterday I received the following report from the lunacy expert employed by Glasgow Corporation:-

"This lad is the subject of dementia precox. He is subject to periods of confusion, and sometimes becomes excitable and violent. I regard the prognosis as very grave, and he is certainly not now, or likely ever to be, fit for military service."

I have to-day obtained Sheriff's Warrant and have applied to Headquarters for the necessary sanction to have him transferred to the Glasgow District Asylum, Woodilee, Lenzie. Will you be so good as to advise me re invaliding Documents. Army Form B.179 has been prepared and would, in the ordinary course, be sent to D.D.M.S., Scottish Command, for approval. Kindly advise me if this procedure should be carried out or if the/

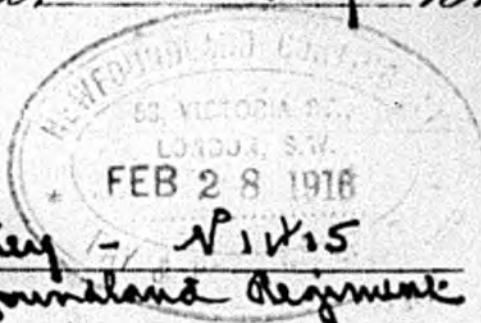




