Opinion of the Medical Board.

Notes.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as, in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Minister of Pensions should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable him to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

Dear Mrs. Hillier:-

Your letter of 6th May addressed to the Colonial Secretary has been forwarded to this Dept. for necessary action. It is noted that you are applying for furlough for 3294, Pte. J.W. Hillier.

The latest War Office regulations concerning furlough for soldiers is that only men will be returned who are being repatriated for discharge. A letter received from the Pay & Record Office, London recently stated that even for some men who are coming home for discharge, it was found very difficult to have transport accommodations arranged.

It is regretted, therefore, that furlough for this soldier cannot at present be given consideration. If the Medical Authorities in the district his Battalion is at present stationed, consider that he will be unfit for future service, either at the depot, Winchester, or in France, a medical board will be held in England and he will be repatriated for discharge.
