

Dear Mrs Reeves,

I am in receipt of your letter of 11th April, concerning your brother, #3034, Pte. Llewellyn Hillier. If you write and quote his No. and Regiment and address the envelope 1/c Pay & Record Office, 58, Victoria Street, London, S.W.1, I think it is fairly certain that the letter will reach him alright, provided of course it is not hung up by the German Authorities, which is a matter that we cannot control.

With regard to sending parcels, I regret to say that the regulations laid down by the War Office, does not allow of private parties sending parcels to Prisoners of War. You are aware of course that three food parcels are forwarded to him every fortnight and clothing parcels at different periods.

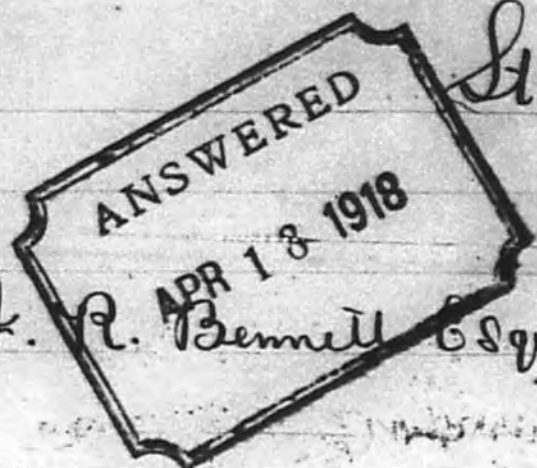

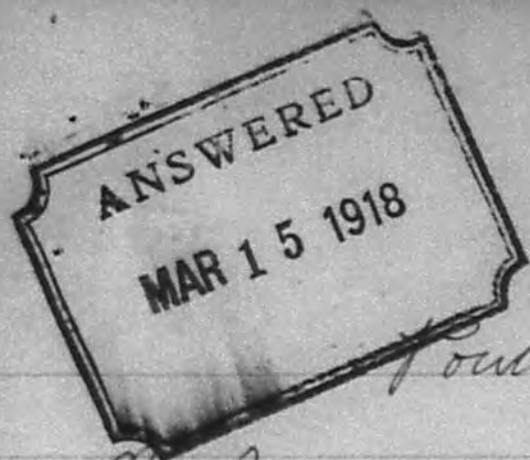

Dear Sir:-

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 4th March and the enclosed post card received by you from No. 5034, Private L. Hillier. This is the first intimation received by this Dept. that this soldier was a prisoner of war, and information was immediately cabled to the Pay & Record Office, London.

The post mark on the post card, which is returned herewith, is very indistinct, and I should be glad, if any further communications are received within the next few days, if you would forward the envelope and post card to me, in order that the Camp in which Pte. Hillier is located might be notified to the Pay & Record Office, London. This is most important, because until it is known what his address is, it will not be possible to despatch the usual food and clothing parcels. I have notified the Record Office, London that the post card marked Geschrieben, but that does not give any indication as to where this soldier is.

With reference to your letter of 18/2/18 (3272) on the subject of the above-named Soldier: I deeply regret to state that a telegram was received at this Office yesterday from the Geneva Red Cross Society to the effect that Pte. Hillier died at LeCateau on 25/1/18. This information was immediately telegraphed to the Minister of Militia. No particulars were given regarding Pte. Hillier's death, but it is of course known that he died in Enemy hands. As you are doubtless aware, he was posted as missing on 3/12/17.

As requested by you, a note has been made in the Postal Branch of this Office to forward any parcels addressed to Pte. Hillier to No. 2279, Pte. George Reeves.
