CORRESPONDENCE re 1558 PTE. R. HILLIER.

- 1. Letter from 1558, Pte. R. Hillier to Pmr. & O. 1/c Rds. 28/7/17 (4085).

I am writing to ask you if you think I could get sent home some time soon. I have been in hospital about thirteen months now with a fractured thigh and I have had about ten operations altogether, but my wounds are still open and very disappointing, but I think if I was home and got fed up well I would get on much better. I can walk around very well and I don't think I will be any good to fight again.

Sir if you will give this your kind attention I will be much obliged.

- 2. Letter 7689/1 30/7/17 from PMR. & O. 1/c RDS. 76 O.C., V.A.D. Hospital, Ashford, Kent.

I have received a letter from this Soldier asking that, if it is possible, he should be sent to Newfoundland.

It is perhaps needless to remark that the suggestion is made with all due deference to medical opinion, and ~~is~~ also the following aspects may be referred to. If it were practicable for him to be sent home, it would be contingent on the possibility of arrangements being made through the courtesy of the Canadian authorities, and their having room for him on a hospital ship going to a Canadian port. The remainder of the journey to St. John's Newfoundland, would have to be completed either by a direct steamer from say Halifax, or as an alternative, by rail ~~from~~ to North Sydney, thence by sea to Port aux Basques, and thence a railway journey occupying about 30 hours.

It may be stated that there are various hospitals and Convalescent Homes in St. John's, and if his condition is such as to permit of such transit as briefly described, it is probable that his return to his own country would be of some benefit.

Awaiting the favour of your kind consideration and reply.

- 3. Reply to above, 8/8/17.

Pte. Hillier will require a great deal more hospital treatment and in all probability he will be of no more service in the Army. If it were possible for Pte. Hillier to receive Hospital treatment on the boat going over, and in hospital on arrival, the transfer would be recommended - by permission of the authorities at Shorncliffe, but it must be clearly understood Pte. Hillier will require Hospital treatment all the time.

It is not advisable for Pte. Hillier to go overseas if (1) he is a Got Case or (2) a case which requires constant dressing. A passage could, however, be arranged if it is thought he is capable of standing the voyage. He should be boarded on A.F. B.179 before this can take place. If the authorities at Shorncliffe agree to his repatriation on these conditions and you furnish A.F. B.179 to this office it will be easy to send Pte. Hillier ~~at~~ home.

- 5. Memo 8239/1 13/8/17 from P & R.O. to PTE. R. HILLIER.

In reply to your letter of the 28/7/17: I have written to the Commandant of your Hospital and am informed that you still require hospital treatment. In view of this statement I should strongly recommend you to remain for a while longer where you are. As soon as you are able to travel, and provided you are not fit for further service overseas, arrangements will be made for your return to Newfoundland.





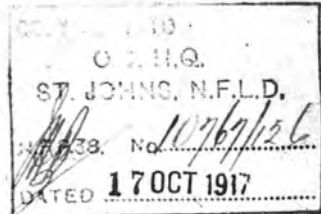

I have received a letter from this Soldier asking that, if it is possible, he should be sent to Newfoundland.

As you will be aware he was wounded on 1/7/16 and has since been in hospital.

It is perhaps needless to remark that the suggestion is made with all due deference to medical opinion, and also the following aspects may be referred to. If it were practicable for him to be sent home, it would be contingent on the possibility of arrangements being made through the courtesy of the Canadian authorities, and their having room for him on a hospital ship going to a Canadian port. The remainder of the journey to St. John's, Newfoundland, would have to be completed either by a direct steamer from, say, Halifax, or as an alternative, by rail to North Sydney, thence by sea to Post aux Basques, and thence a railway journey occupying about 30 hours.

It may be stated that there are various hospitals and Convalescent Homes in St. John's, and if his condition is such as to permit of such transit as briefly described, it is probable that his return to his own Country would be of some benefit.

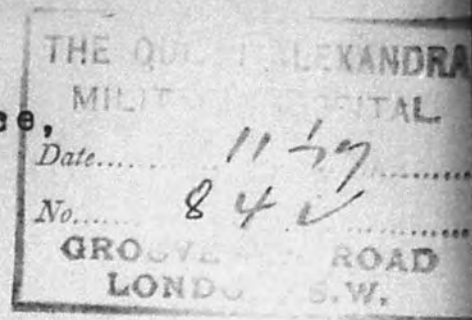
