Dear Mrs. Hiscock,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of May 27th to the Minister of Militia, in which you make inquiries about your son, #3447 Pte. Alfred Hiscock, reported killed in Action March 14th 1918. It is noted that the Regimental Number given in our notification to you was #3477, but I may say that this is purely a clerical error, and we are sorry that this should have occurred. As to your son being a Prisoner in Germany, or being still alive,—while not wishing to deprive you of any little hope you may have,—I would say that I think there is very little doubt that it was your son #3447 Pte. Alfred Hiscock *who* was killed on March 14th 1918. As to your receiving any of his Personal Effects, I would say that in due course everything belonging to him that can be found, will be forwarded from the Record Office, London, to St. John's, for delivery to you; but this will be some little time yet.

As I have already stated, I would advise you not to attach too much importance in this difference in Regimental Numbers, because undoubtedly it is due to error. However, in accordance with your request, we shall telegraph London for particulars of your son's death, and upon receipt of a reply, we shall again communicate with you.
