With reference to the payment of pension to the above mentioned man, the Board of Pension Commissioners have cancelled the instructions contained in their letter of Feb.21/19. Instructions in their letter of March 29th are as follows:

Pension is being issued to ex Pte. E. P. Hiscock as instructed.

The N.M.D. Form 98 is being held pending expiry of period for which Pension has been granted, namely 28/12/18 to 27/12/19. Reboard will be arranged shortly before the latter date and the Documents forwarded to you as customary.

"Hiscock was paid from this Office up to Aug.27th. 1918. Our instructions, therefore, to the Pay & Record Office, London, should have been to have him paid 40%, equal to \$16.00 per month from that date to Dec. 27/18, when his pension expired. Regarding his re-board of Dec.21/18, kindly request Pay & Record Office to pay 2927.. Hiscock for twelve months from Dec.27/18, equal to \$16.00 Per month to Dec.31/18, and from Jan.1/19, equal to \$20.00 per month.

As this ex soldier was re-boarded 21/12/18, it is understood that although the letter from the D.M.S. appears to require his re-boarding as soon as possible, this does not agree with the instructions from the Pension Commissioners, and verification of the action proposed by this office is requested.

Papers for his re-boarding are enclosed, together with a letter from the Director of Medical Services.







Dear Sir —

In a copy of the "Evening Telegram" of 5/2/19 which I received from Newfoundland quite recently I saw the notice from Minister of Militia concerning pay and gratuities of discharged Newfoundland soldiers.

It states that the allowance to be paid is in addition to already existing allowances.

It says that men discharged after 1/4/17, should receive \$45 for clothes. I was discharged on 2/5/17, and received only \$25 for clothes. By the new order I am entitled to \$20 more for clothes.

The notice also states that men who have served in actual theatre of war for less than one year to receive ^[Ninety Two] 192 days pay and allowances on discharge. I did not receive this and by the order I am entitled to it.

I would be very thankful if you could see

into the matter for me.

I would also like to acquaint you of a few facts concerning my pension. For the year 1918 my pension was \$16 per month. Before coming on this side to College in 1918; on the recommendation of Lt. Col. Bendall then acting Chief Militia; my pension was made payable from Record Office London.

On 21/12/18 I had a Medical Board at 4th Northern Hospital Lincoln and since then have heard nothing from Newfoundland authorities about the result of the "Board" or my pension. I have written authorities Lincoln and they inform me that the result of the "Board" was forwarded to Record Office London on 21/12/18.

Sir, in a College where a great percentage of the students are ex-soldiers; some incapacitated more, some less than I am, all getting their pension regularly from the English government one cannot but feel that the Newfoundland Government is not doing so much for her soldiers — her volunteers, as the English Government is doing for her conscripts.

I do not think it is the intention of the Officials

of our Country to treat her men like this, far from it.

Sir, knowing you to be a true friend of the soldier I feel sure this matter will find careful consideration at your hands.

I can assure you Sir, that I shall be very much obliged for any light on the subject.

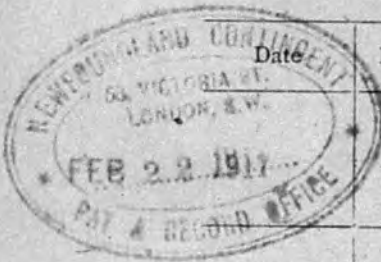
