NOTES.—(i.) 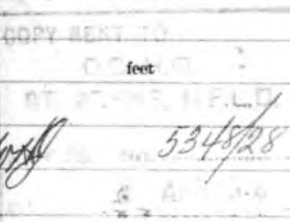

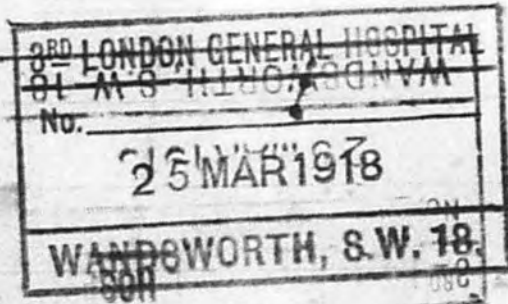
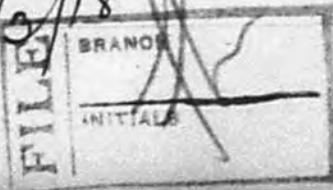
