Pte. Hollett was wounded on October 2, 1918, in the lt. thigh, 3 inches above knee and lt. groin. The wound of thigh healed in a few days, and has remained healed since. The wound of his groin never healed. At first its discharge diminished to a small and intermittent amount but later an abscess formed, which was opened. Discharge has been continuous since. Some time after his wound he developed rt. sided swelling and pain. This was opened and two sinuses have been discharging ever since. The sinuses are stated to be secondarily infected with K.L. but on Feb. 20th, 1920, the Provincial Laboratory reports discharge negative for K.L. On July 13, 1920, an operation for drainage incision in the Left Loin by Lt. Col. Starr. Pocket of pus not found, right sinus enlarged, and tube inserted. Jul. 20 1920 had a smart secondary haemorrhage from right sinus. General condition poor. Ascites and oedema of the legs. On August 25th, general condition very poor. Abdomen has been tapped several times and quantities of fluid removed to relieve the abdominal tension. Pocket of pus in left loin opened and drained. Patient became progressively weaker and more emaciated. Peritoneal fluid removed several times by puncture. He died at 2 a.m. on September 7th, after having been unconscious for several hours. Cause of death - G.S.W.L. thigh (Osteomyelitis). Immediate Cause - Ascites and Cardiac Failure.


The marginally-noted soldier, who was on the strength of the First Newfoundland Regiment, is now considered seriously ill. It is expected that he may not survive more than two or three months. His Medical Officer reports as follows:

"He had a gunshot wound in the Left Groin, which has been persistently discharging. Recently a similar discharge has been coming from the Right Groin. It is suspected that these Sinuses are tuberculous in origin, as they are tracking down alongside the Psoas Muscle. X-Ray does not show an involvement of the Spine. More recently there has been persistent vomiting and Diarrhoea, which cannot be controlled. This probably, too, is Tubercular Enteritis. He has been going down-hill quite rapidly, and unless he makes some considerable improvement, he will not survive more than two or three months. It is

hoped that he will make better progress when fine weather comes, and he can be placed on the roof in the open air."

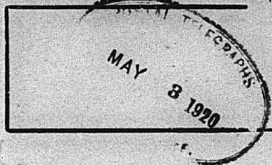

The above noted soldier was being repatriated with the draft that embarked from Liverpool on Sept. 11th/19. He contracted an illness, and it was necessary to leave him in Canada for treatment on arrival there. Report received a few days ago from the Director General Medical Services, Ottawa, states that he is seriously ill in Toronto with Tuberculosis and Enteritis and is not fit to travel. Medical opinion of this Department is that he will not likely recover.

His brother, Mr. Syrus Hollett of Burin, is anxious to visit him, and enquires whether his passage to and back can be arranged at expense of Newfoundland Government. In this connection I might say that next of kin of soldiers reported seriously or dangerously ill, had their transportation to and from France paid ex Imperial Funds. This is the first application received by this Department, of this nature, and I have the honour to request whether transportation or assistance may be authorised by the Government for Mr. Syrus Hollett to visit his brother.

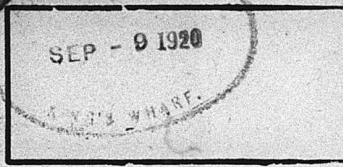
