

I beg to inform you that the late Pte. A. Holloway was buried, with full military honours, at Brookwood Cemetery on 19/10/18. The Firing Party and Bugle Party consisted of men from the South African forces. The service was conducted by the Rev. F.G. Kemp, C.F. The coffin was covered with the Newfoundland flag, and drawn on a gun carriage by representatives of the Dominions beyond the Seas. Pte. Holloway was buried in Grave No. 181737.

Five wreaths were laid upon the coffin: four from the Sisters, Nurses and Comrades of "B" Section, South African Hospital, Richmond Park; and one from the Newfoundland War Contingent Association.

Amongst those who attended at the grave side were a large number of Soldiers from the various Dominions. 2056 Sgt. H. Cranford, of the Pay & Record Office, represented the Newfoundland Contingent.

The Last Post sounded, and a volley of three rounds blank was fired at 1.45 p.m.

Noted, and copy of same has been forwarded to Pte. Holloway's father.

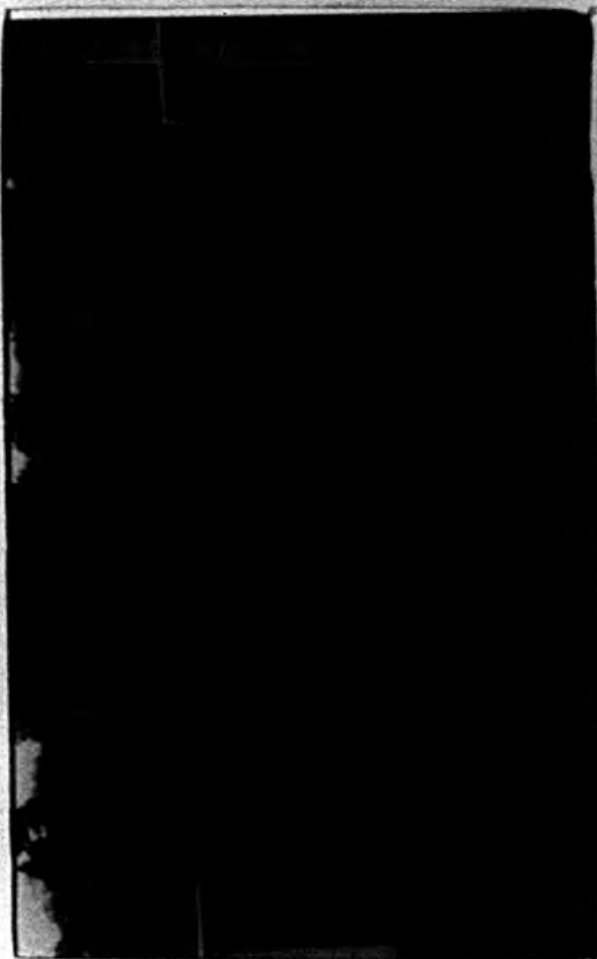

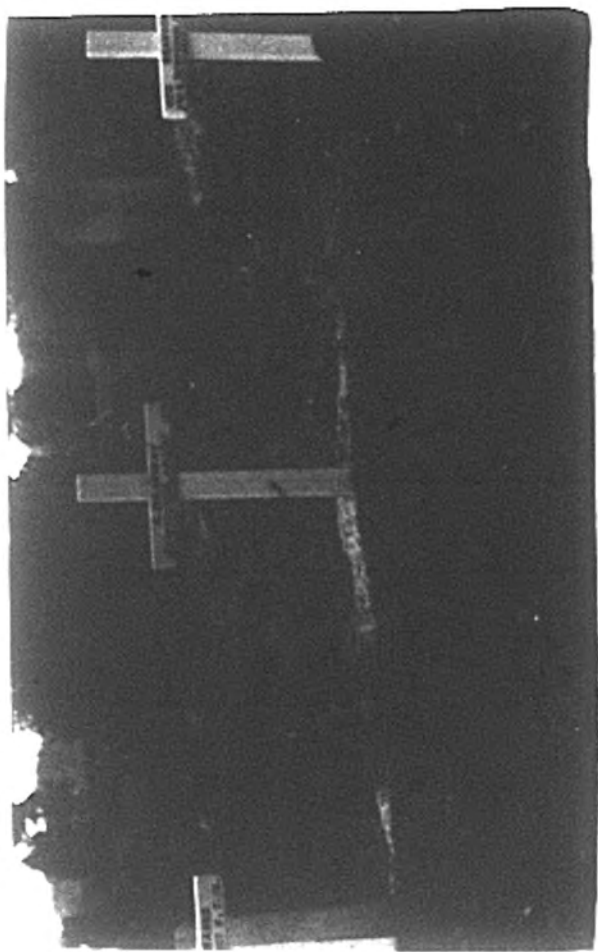
