Sir:

I have your note of the 17th inst., covering letter from Pte. A.J. Holman, of Belleoram, with reference to matters of Pay, Board, and lost Luggage.

For your information I may state that this man was discharged in the United Kingdom at his own request, and whilst residing there drew most of his War Service Gratuity. There was a balance of \$31.53 left to his credit on this account, and this amount was forwarded to us from the Chief Paymaster, London. We have now forwarded Pte. Holman a cheque covering this amount. This represents all the money due him from the Royal Newfoundland Regiment.

His claim for a refund of payments made by him for board during his journey from Scotland is receiving attention.

With regard to his luggage I may say that we are in receipt of a letter from him in this connection, but as he did

not state whether the luggage was left in Scotland or at Liverpool we have written him requesting further particulars with regard to same.

Now having the chance of stating my case to you how I've been treated since being three years and three months in the Army. It is now three months since I received my last pay and on my way home had to pay my own board wherever I was delayed and having sent in my account five weeks ago no heed seems to have been taken of it, also before leaving Scotland the Government kept me in suspense for three weeks and gave me one days notice to get the boat, therefore, through this I lost my luggage, also my wife's, and it is only by chance you can get it passenger on the railroad, so if there is anything you could do on my behalf I should be very pleased.
