STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

2322, Pte. Samuel Hooper - Address Rock Hr, P.B.
Enlisted March 1916 - Proceeded Overseas - July 1916
Place & Date of Capture - Monchy-le-Freux, April 14th/17
Company in France - "B" Company
Circumstances of Capture - I advanced with my company to the first

objective and was wounded in the left side. I was crawling back towards our lines when the Germans overtook me in their counterattack and took me prisoner.

Details of Life & Treatment under Capture - I was sent to a Dressing Station close behind the lines and then on to Hospital in Douai for a week. I was then shifted to Duisberg in Germany, still to Hospital and remained there a month. Our wounds were dressed every three days and they used bandages made of paper every time. We were not given much attention and very little food. I was then shifted to Dulman Camp for three weeks on Light Duty. After that I was sent to Suiten with a working party, at Farm work and I was here up till the Armistice was signed.

We had a very hard time in this Camp especially with the German Guards. They were always ready to find fault with us and to punish us for the least thing. One morning after I had been sick for some days with Influenza, one of the German guards came up to my bed with a fixed bayonet and ordered me out to work. I was quite weak and sick at the time and told him so, in German, but he paid no heed to me and hit me over the body and head with the butt of his rifle and knocked me out of the bed on to the floor. I had to go out and try to work for the day, and when I came back my temperature was 104 degrees. I reported sick to the Officer in charge next morning and he let me stay in bed for the day. It was five days before I was able to get up again. All we got to eat there was a slice of bread for breakfast and a ~~small~~ ladleful of soup for dinner and tea, so that we were nearly starved on top of the hard work. The only parcels I got were the Red Cross Parcels - no private ones from home reached me; very few of my letters ever reached me. On the 11th November I heard rumours at the camp that the Armistice was signed and so I took it upon myself to run away. I stole some civilian clothes and escaped and got to Dulman Camp over 200 miles away, where I gave myself up. They took me in, and the next day put me on the train for Holland for repatriation. I finally arrived on England on Dec. 7th-1918




