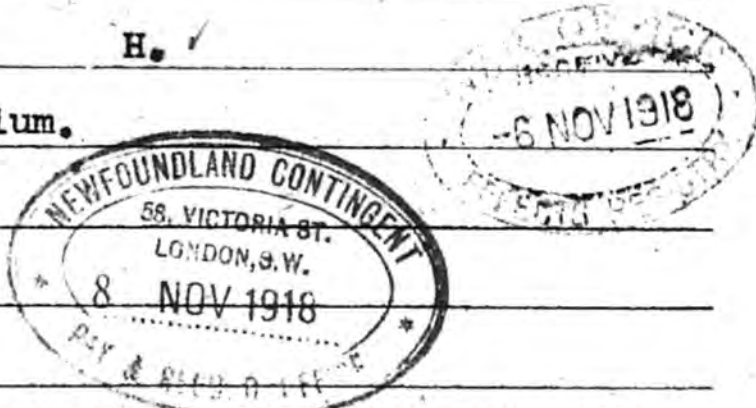

Your letter addressed to the Pay & Record Office, London relative to the death of your son, No. 3694 Pte. H. Horwood, has been forwarded to this Department for attention.

With regard to your query reference the name of the place where your son's death took place: the Battalion moved to Keiberg, Belgium on the 11th of October, and Pte. Horwood was killed in the engagement on the 20th of that month. We have no further particulars that would enlighten you to any extent.

I would state in reply to the part of your letter re the burial place of Pte. Horwood, that Major T. Hangle has been for some time engaged in the location and registering of soldiers' graves in the different areas of war, and having them concentrated into recognised military cemeteries. When each grave has been removed it will be photographed and a copy sent to the next of kin concerned. It is hoped that Major Hangle will be successful in registering Pte. Horwood's grave, in which event you will be notified without delay.

I have made enquiry from the Paymaster relative to his estate, and I am informed that there was no will, and letters of administration were issued to you on 17th Jan, 1919, for the balance due to his account.

8/2/20.

" Gentlemen,

" As I have received no letter from P.R. Office of my sons death 3694 Pte Henry Horwood, only cable saying killed in action on Oct 20th 1918. I have received several papers from St John's to be filled out but as regard to where he was killed or the place he was killed in I have never received a word.

" I would like to know the name of the place and name of the battle he was engaged in when killed, and if he was in charge of Lewis gun when killed. We have never received a word from aurth about him. One would like to know little and more than the words kill in action, like to know where he was buried at, also like to have received his account and will from P.R. Office if he made one, We have never as much received his bible he had in his pocket.
