Dear Sir,

I received the letter from you dated March 12. also the cheque, which I thank you. Well you say you instructed Magistrate March to send me back to St. John's, if there was no other means of getting home. Magistrate March came to me and asked me if I was going to St. John's, and I said, no² I couldn't go and leave my wife amongst strangers, and owing to her condition, she could not do with the journey, after being knocked about in the steamer for fourteen days, so I thought I would remain at Curling untill I would see a chance to get home, And that I did on Feb 22^d, I went to Magistrate and asked him to wire, and ask if you were satisfied to pay expenses for Dog Team, as far as Port Saunders, and as he did so, at that time I had to wait for a train to take me to Dearlake, and when it did come it was too stormy to travel by Dog team. So I told Magistrate March that there was nothing else for me but wait till the steamer run in may, and he said it was

foolish for me, to travel at that time, when I and my wife was living under Government expenses so I considered it at the time, and said I would. Then I thought the Magistrate would advise you at that time, as you say he did not.

And as for me working while waiting to get home, I havent earned one cent because I couldn't I have been feeling sick since ever I left St John's and my leg pains and swells at times.

I think the Government should give me a light job of some sort and a good pension, because I am entitled to it, but for \$10⁰⁰ Per Month its out of the question altogether. When some Soldiers can get \$30⁰⁰ Per Month for only going the length of Halifax surely I can get \$30⁰⁰ for going to France and getting broke up in health. I have only got \$15⁰⁰ since I left St John's Jan 2nd and my wife got \$20⁰⁰ cheque, at the rate of \$10⁰⁰ Per Month I should have got \$30⁰⁰ instead of \$15⁰⁰ since Feb 3rd to April 3rd I think there's a mistake some where, but I hope you will try and do better than that for me. For future letters addressed to me, you might please address them to ^{me} Mr. J. Park.

In connection with the attached correspondence forwarded to me for report. The full circumstances of the case are as follows:-

Early in January Pte. House appeared before the Demobilization Officer for transportation and Release Certificate and stated that his home was in Port Saunders but he wished to proceed to Bonne Bay and remain there for the Winter and he was accordingly issued with a Travelling Warrant to Bonne Bay.

On 20th January a message was received by the Minister of Militia stating that there were two soldiers at Curling and requesting the Department to guarantee expenses to their homes. On enquiry I found that they were Pte. Halfyard of Bonne Bay and Pte. House of Port Saunders. The expenses referred to were to cover cost of hiring a Dog-team from Deer Lake.

On 21st January Magistrate March wired to Depot that Private House's condition would prevent him from walking any distance and so he recommended that he return to St. John's. On the 22nd January I wired Magistrate March instructing him to send House back to St. John's if there was no other means for him to get home than by walking and if he was unfit for the journey to send him back to St. John's and advise me.


On January 30th I received another wire from Magistrate March to the effect that Halfyard had travelled to his home and that House and his wife were expected to travel shortly. On February 1st 12th another telegram was received which stated that House and his wife were remaining at Curling for the Winter and requesting that his Board money be forwarded. On February 14th I wrote to Magistrate March asking for particulars of House's position and whether Houses decision to remain at Curling was owing to inability to ~~make~~ travel to Bonne Bay owing to his physical condition and acting under Doctor's orders, or whether he was working there while awaiting an opportunity to proceed to Bonne Bay or Port Saunders. To this letter I have had no reply.

On February 22nd Magistrate March again wired to the effect that House and Wife were anxious to get to their home in Port Saunders and that the cost of transportation (presumably by dog-team) would be \$60.00. I brought the contents of this telegram to your attention at the time, and at your instructions, I wired to Magistrate March on same date to send them home at first opportunity and advise me. Since that time I have received no further word as to the situation.

My Wifes Allotment was stopped.

Your letter addressed to His Majesty's Government has been handed to me and I note what you state and for your information I enclose copy of correspondence which has passed between the O.C. Depot and Magistrate March of Curling. You will note that the O.C. Depot instructed the Magistrate to send you back to St. John's if there was no other means of getting you home than walking. On February 22 O.C. Depot wire to Magistrate March to send you and your wife home the first opportunity to which he has had no reply. We were under the impression that you were home in Port Saunders and the Pay Officer were awaiting a notification to that effect from you. They are sending out a cheque to your wife. I am enclosing a document for you to fill and sign before a magistrate or J.P. It is for your War Service gratuity, which you will return to Captain Howley, Paymaster and O. i/c Records, St. John's. I am also forwarding document for you to fill in for Separation Allowance if you were married before the 31st August 1917 you will be entitled to your back Separation Allowance and also you will have to forward your marriage certificate. I am very sorry that you and your wife have been put to so much inconvenience but you will remember that it was your own wish to go to Bonne Bay. Hoping that every thing may turn out O.K.

In connection with the attached correspondence forwarded to me for report. The full circumstances of the case are as follows:-

Early in January Pte. House appeared before the Demobilization Officer for transportation and Release Certificate and stated that his home was in Port Saunders but he wished to proceed to Bonne Bay and remain there for the Winter and he was accordingly issued with a Travelling Warrant to Bonne Bay.

On 20th January a message was received by the Minister of Militia stating that there were two soldiers at Curling and requesting the Department to guarantee expenses to their homes. On enquiry I found that they were Pte. Halfyard of Bonne Bay and Pte. House of Port Saunders. The expenses referred to were to cover cost of hiring a Dog-team from Deer Lake.

On 21st January Magistrate March wired to Depot that Private House's condition would prevent him from walking any distance and so he recommended that he return to St. John's. On the 22nd January I wired Magistrate March instructing him to send House back to St. John's if there was no other means for him to get home than by walking and if he was unfit for the journey to send him back to St. John's and advise me.

On January 30th I received another wire from Magistrate March to the effect that Halfyard had travelled to his home and that House and his wife were expected to travel shortly. On February 12th another telegram was received which stated that House and his wife were remaining at Curling for the Winter and requesting that his Board money be forwarded. On February 14th I wrote to Magistrate March asking for particulars of House's position and whether Houses decision to remain at Curling was owing to inability to ~~xxxx~~ travel to Bonne Bay owing to his physical condition and acting under Doctor's orders, or whether he was working there while awaiting an opportunity to proceed to Bonne Bay or Port Saunders. To this letter I have had no reply.

On February 22nd Magistrate March again wired to the effect that House and Wife were anxious to get to their home in Port Saunders and that the cost of transportation (presumably by dog-team) would be \$60.00 I brought the contents of this telegram to your attention at the time and at your instructions, I wired to Magistrate March on same date to send them home t first opportunity and advise me. Since that time I have received no further word as to the situation.

Dear Sir:

With reference to the various telegrams that have passed between us concerning 1946 Pte. A. House, the last intimation I have received from you is a telegram dated Feb. 12th, stating that House and wife are remaining in Curling for the winter and requesting his board money to be forwarded.

Will you kindly advise me as to his present position - whether his decision to remain at Curling is in consequence of his being unable to travel to Bonne Bay owing to his physical condition and acting under the doctor's advice, or whether he has set himself to work in Curling for the remainder of the winter whilst awaiting the opportunity to proceed to Bonne Bay or Port Saunders, as the case may be.

If he is staying on purely and simply on account of being unable to travel owing to his wounds, then his board bill will be paid until he proceeds home; but he must pay his wife's expenses himself. He should then avail of the first opportunity of resuming his journey home, if the doctor thinks him fit. If on the other hand he is working and receiving pay, he will be responsible for his own board and other expenses.

Meanwhile I shall certify his own board bill from Jan. 4th to Feb. 12th, the date of your last message.



Dear Sir:-

Your letter of April 26th to the Minister of Militia concerning the Board-bill of #1946 Pte A. House and wife has been passed to me.

There has been a lot of correspondence concerning this soldier and letters and telegrams have been sent to Magistrate March from time to time. In short the circumstances of his case are as follows:

On January 2nd Pte House was discharged from the Regiment and transportation for himself and his wife was given him to Port Saunders. He reached as far as Curling where we were advised that he was ~~sick~~ unable to proceed any further owing to his condition and to the state of his health. Since that time efforts have been made either to send him back to St. John's or to arrange for him to carry on to his home. It was understood at the time that he and his wife were to be boarded at Curling until such time as he could go home.




