



The Receiving Office, at Lewisporte informed us on receipt of this last message that party has moved to Toronto.

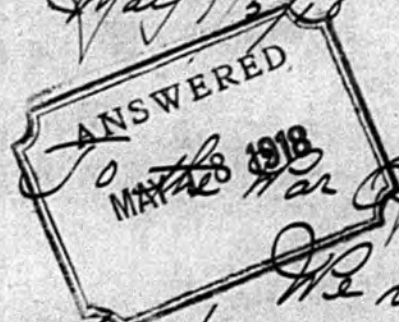

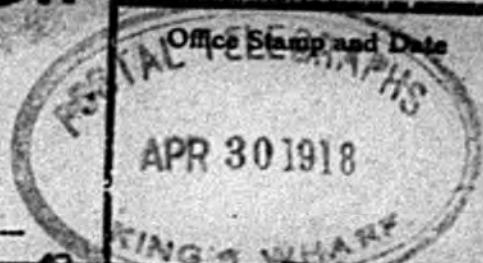

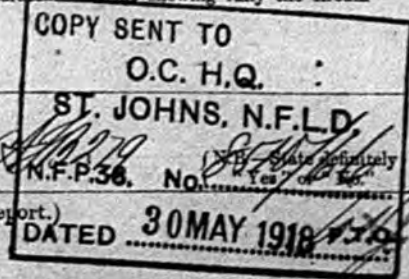
