Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the funeral of the late Pte. L.G. Hudson who died of tuberculosis in hospital here on the 3rd inst., took place to-day at 11 a.m. It was attended by a party of 18 Englishmen, comprising one N.C.O. from practically all the Regiments represented in the camp, one attending on behalf of our own. A very fine wreath was provided by his companions here. The burial service was read by Pte. Ellis of the 8th. Bn. Canadians. The military authorities provided a Guard of Honour consisting of 8 men and one N.C.O.

I may add that Sergt. Moakler, Corpl. Doody and myself periodically visited Pte. Hudson during his illness, and did our utmost to cheer him. The two former being on the staff of the Post Office here, were thus prevented from being present to-day.

A memorial to all Englishmen who have died in this camp, is now nearing completion, and of course Pte. Hudson's name will be included. The funds to pay for this were raised through a series of weekly concerts given by the English prisoners of war here. When it is erected and I can procure a photograph, I shall forward one to you as it may be of interest.

Dear Sir,

You will be pleased to know that I am now regularly in receipt of ~~the~~ packets and mail that you are sending me, also the packets which you sent me in the early days of my capture are now reaching me, and I thank you for the clothing issue which reached me in February and was such a welcome packet. I am in the best of health as are the other twenty or thirty Newfoundlanders who are attached to this camp, with the exception of Ptes. Hudson and McKay who are in the camp Hospital suffering ~~from~~ with consumption. They have a fighting chance but as you are aware one cannot be too sure. I visit them often and sometimes they seem well but at times they are very bad. I should be very much obliged if you could forward a draft for ten pounds (10) to my brother Mr. Alfred Moakler, c/o. A.J. Harvey & Co., St. John's also if you could forward me a statement of my account. In case you can manage this remittance and such is allowed, I trust letter will suffice, if not I shall fill in any necessary forms which you may send. Sir,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 1st instant covering a communication which you received from your son who is a prisoner of war in Germany. You evidently did not read the letter of the Minister of Militia which was published in all the papers some two or three weeks ago, in which it was intimated that no parcels could be sent to prisoners in Germany. Arrangements, however, have been made, through a Central Committee, that three parcels per fortnight would be sent forward to all prisoners. Such parcels would contain all necessaries and your son has no doubt been receiving such before this. Several notices have appeared in the newspapers in relation to this matter but I suppose you did not see any of such papers. You may, however, rest assured that your boy will be well cared for by the central Committee in London and your next letter will probably advise you of this. I return herewith his communication to you.

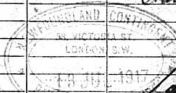

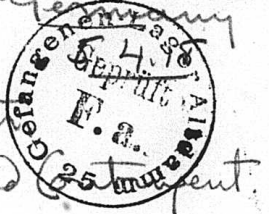

The following has been received from the Imperial War Graves Commission regarding the grave of the above-mentioned soldier who was reported to have died at the Camp Hospital, Altdamm, and buried in Altdamm Prisoners of War Cemetery -

"The bodies of the British Soldiers were removed from that Cemetery and reburied in Berlin South Western Cemetery.

It is regretted, however, that when the grave marked with his name was opened no remains were found, and that all efforts to find the actual grave were unsuccessful.

In the circumstances instructions have been issued for a Special Memorial Cross bearing his name to be erected in Berlin South Western Cemetery. This cross will be replaced by a permanent memorial bearing the following inscription:-

"TO THE MEMORY OF 2214 PRIVATE L. HUDSON,
ROYAL NEWFOUNDLAND REGT., 2nd APRIL 1918,
WHO DIED AS PRISONER OF WAR AND WAS BURIED
AT THE TIME IN ALTDAMM PRISONER OF WAR CEMETERY,
BUT WHOSE GRAVE IS NOW LOST.
THEIR GLORY SHALL NOT BE BLOTTED OUT."
