Dear Madam,

Referring to my letter of the 3rd May last, in which it was my painful duty to inform you of the death in Scotland on May the 2nd of your son, No. 1568, Private Howard Hulan, and to my further letter of the 5th May, in which I notified you of the cause of his death, I beg to say that I am now in receipt of a report, by mail, which gives further particulars regarding the case, which are as follows:-

He was admitted, on the 31st December 1915, to Crofthead Hospital, suffering from Measles. Shortly after admission, he developed Pneumonia, which later developed into Pulmonary Tuberculosis. He was transferred to Carrick House Auxiliary Hospital on the 15th February last, in which Hospital he was confined to his bed, until his death on May 2nd.

I have no doubt that you will be glad to receive these further particulars with respect to your son's illness and death.

I beg to state, that we are now in a position to continue such payments to his dependants, and will willingly do so, if this is what they require.

With regard to his Estate, by which I mean his Effects, and the balance of Pay due to him at the time of his death. I have just received from the Colonial Secretary various lists of Effects, which have been forwarded from England, but which have not yet been received here, and I might say that Pte. Hulan's are not included in the lists. I have also very recently received a large parcel of Accounts of deceased men; these have to be adjusted at this end, converted into Currency, and the amounts transferred to the Minister of Justice for final disposal, but I fear that owing to the great press of ^{very} important matters in this office at the present time, it will be some little time before I shall be able to handle them. I trust however, that as soon as I get through with this month's Pay, to be able to settle down to this, and get them attended to as rapidly as possible.
