Your Excellency:-

Yours of the 24th addressed to the Chairman with reference to Magistrate Oke's letter as to no allotment by Pte. Harvey Hull, First Newfoundland Regiment, to his wife, has been handed to me, and I have had the matter inquired into. I find that Hull, who left here at the end of August, made an allotment to his wife of 70 cents a day. Her first allotment cheque would not be sent out till the end of September, and would not reach her on Labrador until some time in this month. Hence her complaint through Mr. Oke. We have no doubt, however, that it has reached her by this time, but as the amount is small -- \$4.90 per week for a woman and four children -- we have aided it with an allowance of one dollar and a half per week from the Patriotic Fund, particularly in view of the circumstance that the prices of all foodstuffs would be very high on Labrador this winter. I am writing her a special letter to say that through the winter her husband's allotment and this additional amount will be sent to her by cheque from month to month, and that she can show this letter to the trader, the relieving officer, or the Hudson Bay Co. agent, and thus obtain advances in case such should be necessary.

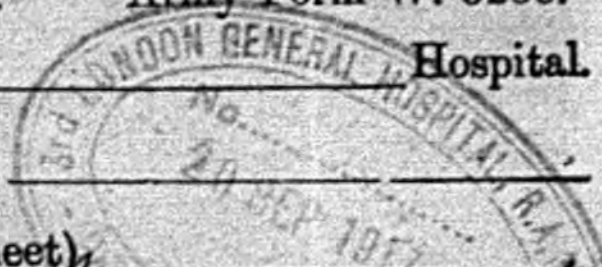
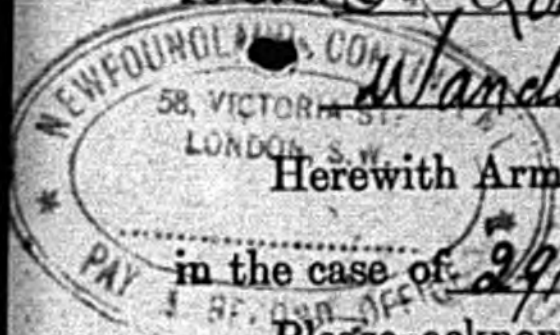

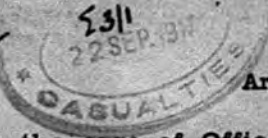
