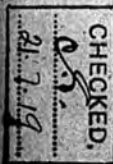

I might state that before this man left Newfoundland, a few weeks ago, he stated to me that his wife had given him \$80.00, and that she would draw his pension as it became payable. I concluded that he would have given his instructions in this connection to you before his departure. Hussey stated that he was going to St. John and would endeavour to secure passage to the United Kingdom with a view to obtaining work as a steward on transport ships sailing to Australia. It is not thought that his address will be known for some little time unless he communicates with his wife or others on his arrival in the United Kingdom.

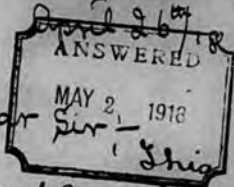

time back to the trenches.  
He has not been dealt very fairly

He has seen hard times. He thinks  
himself he should have furlough  
home. Because last year he  
was kept in Scotland for  
1/2 month & never had the chance  
to come, then of course he planned  
to come himself. I think that  
out of consideration he was a  
married man with little children  
& not fit for active service  
in such a long time they  
should have sent him home  
which would have prevented  
a lot of trouble both for him  
and for me because they  
stopped the allotment

and I was the one to suffer.  
Some can come if their leave  
is just 6 weeks and why  
not mine. Could you tell  
me why. Don't you think he  
did his part; don't he deserve  
a furlough home as well as any  
one else. plenty never went  
when they should go to take  
his place. I feel it very  
hard I reared his little  
children, I had to give  
him up it was indeed hard  
for me to do it & leave me  
with 2 children one 2 years  
and another 6 weeks.

Dear Mrs. Hussey,

I am in receipt of your letter of 9th January concerning your husband, #2014 P te. H. Hussey. I am sorry to inform you that on the 15th of November 1917, he was awarded sixteen months detention by a Court Martial.

You are already aware of the fact that he was was a deserter earlier in the year. He was under orders for France and was proceeding on October 20th, when he escaped; thus having a second charge of desertion against him, and it is for the second offence that he has been awarded this term of detention.

I think it is very likely that any mail sent by you while he was absent, would be kept by the 2nd Battalion and handed over to him when he was captured. Of course it must be remembered that ships are constantly being sunk, in fact we have been notified that at least two which sailed since the first of November and which carried large Newfoundland mail, were sunk by submarines. Apart from that I think it most likely that your husband has been receiving the letters and parcels that you have forwarded. I think you can rest assured of that fact and he has no cause to suppose that you are neglecting



My husband is a man that drinks & I know and I suppose the officers are hard on him but surely about anything else they would not deny him the privilege of writing to his home or not to give him his letters. He complained of not having any letters or getting any parcels. I address them to pay & Record Office London. do you think he gets them? It's a strange thing he never did this before and he is away 2 years & always wrote until now. I'm doing my part - he is scarcely an hour from my thoughts. I feel pretty bad over it too, & if he don't get what I send him I can't do no more unless you find out he does get his mail & the fault rests entirely on himself in regards to writing



I dont want him to think that I've forgotten him or  
neglects him and even if anything happens I will not  
be able to sit & think that I never troubled about him  
I am sending him a parcel in Thursday's mail  
of 2 letters & 2 post cards. Addressed in 90 pay

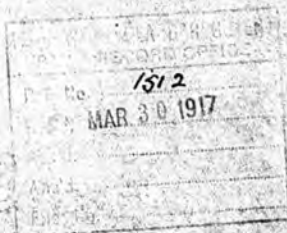




