Borium Sulph given at 12.5 p.m.. It passed through oesophagus without obstruction and stomach assumed a circular state almost immediately, some of the Ba 804 had passed through the pylorus and appeared to right of the vertebrae column passing upwards, evidently in first part of doudenum.

At 1.20 p.m. Stomach presented appearance as showing, meal occupying the fundis and pyloric region with a clear space between. There was nothing seen to right of vertebrae column, evidently the doudenum had voided itself. Small amounts seen to-right-of-vertebrae in various parts of abdomen, thus passing along small intestine.

At 3.20 p. m. Stomach presented appearance as showing. The stomach in more or less horizontal position, contracting still with a good deal of meal inside and a good deal still in ex-doudenum. Mass in small intestine in pelvis.

At 3.35 p.m/ Plate taken.

At 4.00 p.m. There was gas seen in fundus of stomach with a bolus of Ba 804 at beginning of anturp also a considerable amount was visible in the doudenum and also in the jejunum first part.

At 5.00 p. m. There was still a small amount of Ba.804 in stomach and the doudenum had voided itself. Throughout the small intestine there were particles of abscurity scattered broadcast at different levels.

Notes.—(i.)
