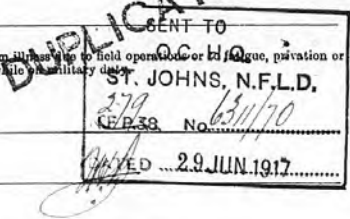



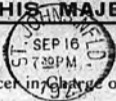

Mrs. Hussey of Merrymeeting Rd., a parisher of mine, has asked me to state in response to your request what her material circumstances are. I am glad to do so hoping that it may assist her in her quest at your office.

She gave three sons to the war. One, her mainstay, was killed. Another had the misfortune to lose his wife and then turned over to his mother his six small children and went himself to the U.S.A. The third son upon his return from France, married. Mrs. Hussey has an invalid husband who receives a small pension from the City. I believe the entire care of these children- there are four left now I think - and the sick husband has developed upon the wife and grandmother. She is very industrious and does her very best to meet her unnecessary responsibilities. But she is behind in her rent and find it difficult to make ends meet. St. Thomas' Parish help her to the extent of \$10.00 per month and that is, all we can do. She thinks there is Separation Allowance due to her. Is this is so, I hope she may be successful in her appeal to you.
