## Opinion of the Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

Dear Mrs. Hynes:-

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter of 16th Jan. concerning the matter of pension on account of your husband, 1715, Private A. Hynes, deceased.

I am instructed to inform you that matters concerning pension are handled entirely by the Pensions and Disabilities Board, whose ruling must be accepted as final.

It is noted that your husband was discharged on 30th April, 1916, and that he married after his discharge. Under the War Pensions Act, Section 34, it is not possible to consider the matter of pension in your case. Section 34 reads as follows:-

The widow of a member of the forces should not be entitled to a pension unless her marriage or relationship to him existed before the disability which resulted in his death was incurred. Reference also, is made to Section 35, sub-section 36:- Pension shall not be paid to the widow, unless her marriage, or relationship with the pensioner existed before he incurred the disability for which the pension was awarded; and unless she continued to live with him up to the time of his death.

It is regretted, therefore, that <sup>as</sup> your marriage was contracted after the discharge of Private Hynes, no pension can be

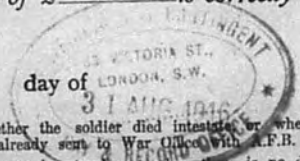

He is anaemic and thin; suffers from cough with a night mucopurulent expectoration. Temperature fine febrile after admission to Stobhill varied between normal and 101°F. Physical exam. gives signs of incipient phthisis at apex of left lung. The right ear is now well. I consider him a suitable case for Sanaeroin treatment.

## Opinion of the Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as, in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

(ii.) Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," &c., should be avoided.

(iii.) The rates of pension vary directly according to whether the disability is attributed to (a) active service, (b) climate, or (c) ordinary military service. It is therefore essential when assigning the cause of the disability to differentiate between them (see Articles 1162 and 1165, Pay Warrant, 1913).

Dear Reverend Sir,

Permit me to address you regarding the late 1715 Private Aloysius Hynes, Fox Cove, whose death was attributable to war service. We have addressed several letters to Mrs. A. Hynes, widow of the deceased soldier, but have failed to receive a reply.

I should like to explain that the Imperial War Graves Commission agree to treat all graves of deceased soldiers whose death is attributable to war services and which occurred between the 4th. August, 1914, and the 31st. August, 1921, as entitled to War Grave, and treat them in the same manner as War Graves in war areas.

I am enclosing a circular letter which will give some idea of the size of the Plot, dimensions of headstones and concrete curb, sodding, planting of bulbs and flowers, etc.

Will you kindly take this matter up with the family of the deceased on our behalf and secure their permission to treat the grave of our deceased comrade as a war grave.

Kindly acknowledge at the earliest possible moment. Any expenses incurred by you will be met by this Department.

Kindly wire collect the decision of the next-of-kin in this  
respect.
