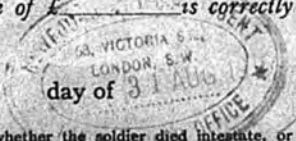

I therefore have the honour to state, that during a recent visit to the 2nd Bn., following a discussion with the O.C., Hynes was re-enlisted as per triplicate copy of Attestation - A.F. B.2505 - enclosed.

Hynes and his wife are now awaiting transport to Newfoundland. In all probability they will have to travel by separate ships, the reasons for which apply generally, the opportunities for transport for women and children being uncertain and very much restricted.

The history of this case being of a somewhat peculiar and disjointed nature extending over a lengthy period, for ready elucidation it has been deemed desirable to recapitulate the whole of the correspondence, copies of which are enclosed.

The amount of £5:10:0 refunded to the Soldiers & Sailors Help Society has been debited to Account No. 4, H.Q., St. John's, and it is presumed it will be dealt with in connection with any settlement that may be made with Hynes. With regard to the cheque which Your Excellency was kind enough to send, under the circumstances this was not made use of, and is returned herein.

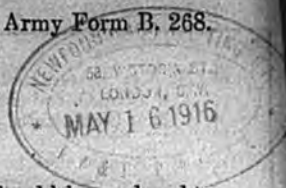

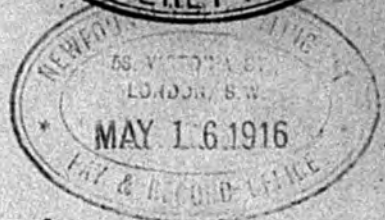

An enquiry on the subject has been received from the Soldiers & Sailors Help Society, Edinburgh, which has rendered Hynes some temporary assistance.

I regret that I am unable to adopt the course suggested by Mr. Howley in attached letter.

In the first place there is already an excess here of men fit only for light duty.

In the second place, if Hynes is fit even for Light Duty at a Depot he should be able to earn his livelihood at a Munitions Factory or elsewhere.

In the third place, is he is not fit for any employment, he is clearly unfit for the Army in any capacity.

Sir,-

I beg to bring to your notice the case of Private John F. Hynes, late 2/1st. Newfoundland Regiment, No. 238.

This man was discharged according to his discharge certificate on the 13th, May, 1916, with tuberculosis soon after his return from the Dardanelles. He states that he is to get a pension, but he has so far received none.

He has been working off and on, but the annexed certificate shows that he is not fit for work at present, and the man is so clearly unfit for any, except light work, that I have not thought it necessary to get a second opinion on his case, and no doubt before discharge he was examined with a view to pension.

I beg to ask the favour of your kindly making representation to the proper quarter, with a view to expediting the issue of his pension.

Further, this man needs immediate money help, pending receipt of pension, and is now unfit for work. Can you give him a temporary allowance such as is given in the British Service to men until their pension is settled. Hynes being in immediate need this Society has lent him £2/- on his promise to repay, and we shall continue to help him for the present, if necessary. I presume that he will, if he gets pension, get arrears from date of discharge. If he is refused pension, which seems unlikely, the loans to him will become grants.

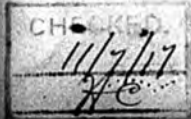

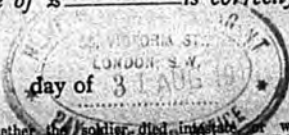

I beg to bring to your notice the case of Private John F. Hynes, late 2/1st Newfoundland Regiment, No. 238.

This man was discharged according to his discharge certificate on the 13th May, 1916, with tuberculosis soon after his return from the Dardanelles. He states that he is to get pension, but he has so far received none.

He has been working off and on, but the annexed certificate shows that he is not fit for work at present, and the man is so clearly unfit for any except light work that I have not thought it necessary to get a second opinion on his case, and no doubt before discharge he was examined with a view to pension.

I beg to ask the favour of your kindly making representation to the proper quarter with a view to expediting the issue of his pension.

Further, this man needs immediate money help, pending receipt of pension, as he is now unfit for work. Can you give him a temporary allowance such as is given in the British Service to men until their pension is settled. Hynes being in immediate need this Society has lent him 22/- on his promise to repay, and we shall continue/

continue to help him for the present; if necessary. I presume that he will, if he gets pension, get arrears from date of discharge. If he is refused pension, which seems unlikely, the loans to him will become grants.

Mr. Harry Rawson,
has written Hon. John Anderson, of this city, on behalf of
No. 238, Private John Francis Hynes, of the Newfoundland
Regiment, who was invalided out of the service at Ayr, married
a Scotch woman, and established himself in residence in
Edinburgh, but who now finding his health broken down, is
seeking repatriation to this country.

Our understanding of the matter is that Hynes, when
he took his discharge, elected to locate in the British Isles
and signed clear from the Regiment, and that he had no valid
claim for pension. As, however, it is desirable that there
should be no cause for complaint, we shall be glad if you will
forward us his medical history sheets, copies of the same, or a
statement regarding his physical condition at the time of his
discharge, that will enable us to hand the matter to the Pension
Board and have his case dealt with on its merits. In the
meantime we have written to Colonel Whittaker at Ayr asking if
he could find any employment for Hynes about the Depot there,
but obviously all of this is a mere temporary expedient, and
it is desirable that we should know all the facts and be in
a position to intelligently deal with them.

A reply at your earliest convenience will be
appreciated.

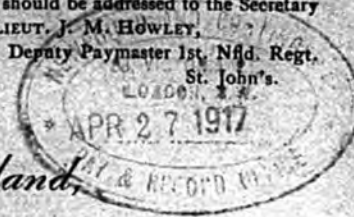

Your memorandum of March 16 covering copy of code telegram from Major Timewell anent ex-private John F. Hynes, was duly received and submitted to the Pension Board at its meeting on Tuesday night, when the attached documents were also considered in connection with it, and it was agreed that I should point out to you that the only document transmitted from England regarding this man is copy of "proceedings on discharge." This shows that the record respecting Hynes's health is "broken in health by illness, but should recover completely and become able to work with unimpaired vigor." This is not signed, nor does it disclose the nature of his disability or its extent. Under these circumstances, it is obviously impossible for us to make any provision for him in the way of pension without further information, and particularly in view of the comment that the man's health would become speedily restored.

It was ordered also that a letter be forwarded to Major Timewell asking that steps be taken for the "boarding" of Hynes to determine as to the merits of his claim for pension.

Further to my No. 3144/26, 9/4/17: although this case has formed the subject of correspondence through other channels in Newfoundland, the varied circumstances under review having so far culminated, it is thought desirable that I should again address Your Excellency.

I therefore have the honour to state, that during a recent visit to the 2nd Bn., following a discussion with the O.C., Hynes was re-enlisted as per triplicate copy of Attestation - A.F. B.2505 - enclosed.

Hynes and his wife are now awaiting transport to Newfoundland. In all probability they will have to travel by separate ships, the reasons for which apply generally, the opportunities for transport for women and children being uncertain and very much restricted.

The history of this case being of a somewhat peculiar and disjointed nature extending over a lengthy period, for ready elucidation it has been deemed desirable to recapitulate the whole of the correspondence, copies of which are enclosed.

The amount of £5:10:0 refunded to the Soldiers & Sailors Help Society has been debited to Account No. 4, H.Q., St. John's, and it is presumed it will be dealt with in connection with any settlement that may be made with Hynes. With regard to the cheque which Your Excellency was kind enough to send, under the circumstances this was not made use of, and is returned herein.

1. Letter 8/2/17 (736) from Soldiers & Sailors Help Society, Edinburgh to P & R.O.

I beg to bring to your notice the case of Private John F. Hynes, late 2/1st Newfoundland Regiment, No. 238.

This man was discharged according to his discharge certificate on the 13th May, 1916, with tuberculosis soon after his return from the Dardanelles. He states that he is to get pension, but he has so far received none.

He has been working off and on, but the annexed certificate shows that he is not fit for work at present, and the man is so clearly unfit for any except light work that I have not thought it necessary to get a second opinion on his case, and no doubt, before discharge he was examined with a view to pension.

I beg to ask the favour of your kindly making representation to the proper quarter with a view to expediting the issue of his pension.

Further, this man needs immediate money help, pending receipt of pension, as he is now unfit for work. Can you give him a temporary allowance such as is given in the British Service to men until their pension is settled. Hynes being in immediate need this Society has lent him 22/- on his promise to repay, and we shall continue to help him for the present, if necessary. I presume that he will, if he gets pension, get arrears from date of discharge. If he is refused pension, which seems unlikely, the loans to him will become grants.

I certify that John Hynes, 18 St. James Square, suffers from Bronchitis (Phthisis?) and Debility and is unfit for work.

With reference to your letter 8/2/17 (736), matters relating to pensions are dealt with over in Newfoundland, there being very few cases concerning men remaining in this Country, as almost invariably discharged soldiers return to Newfoundland.

In this instance Hynes elected to take his discharge in this Country, and I am not aware of any application for a pension having been made by him.

Having regard to the apparent urgency of the matter and the present uncertainty and delay of overseas correspondence, the case, without prejudice, is being made a special one, and a telegram has been despatched accordingly to Headquarters, St. John's, Newfoundland, for instructions, on receipt of which you will be further communicated with.

Meanwhile it is noted that certain disbursements have been made by you, which will be duly protected.

7. Letter 14/3/17 (1675) from Finance Com. N.P.A. to P & R.O.

Mr. Harry Rawson has written Hon. John Anderson, of this city, on behalf of No.238, Private John Francis Hynes, of the Newfoundland Regiment, who was invalided out of the service at Ayr, married a Scotch woman, and established himself in residence in Edinburgh, but who now finding his health broken down, is seeking repatriation to this country.

Our understanding of the matter is that Hynes, when he took his discharge, elected to locate in the British Isles and signed clear from the Regiment, and that he had no valid claim for pension. As, however, it is desirable that there should be no cause for complaint, we shall be glad if you will forward us his medical history sheets, copies of the same, or a statement regarding his physical condition at the time of his discharge, that will enable us to hand the matter to the Pension Board and have his case dealt with on its merits. In the meantime we have written to Colonel Whittaker at Ayr asking if he could find any employment for Hynes about the Depot there, but obviously all of this is a mere temporary expedient, and it is desirable that we should know all the facts and be in a position to intelligently deal with them.

A reply at your earliest convenience will be appreciated.


