I enclose copy of a letter which I have just addressed to the man named above. In the month of March, 1920 this man was granted assistance in the sum of three hundred and twenty dollars (\$320) towards course in Theology in preparation for the Ministry to be begun in September 1920. He has now made application to be allowed to defer the course until September 1921. The Civil Re- establishment Committee has agreed, the reason<sup>given</sup> being quite satisfactory. It was promised that the money should be paid in two moieties; the first upon his entering an approved College as a matriculated student, and the second upon a satisfactory report from the College authorities at the end of the first half year. He was also granted an additional amount of \$50,00 towards transportation once each way.

I have received your letter of the 20th inst., having reference to Cpl. Christian and Cpl. G. Ivany. The former N.C.O. I know very well, personally. I was talking to him at Winchester, during one of my visits there.

I am writing Colonel Barton in reference to these two young soldiers, and asking that their applications be given consideration when he is sending cadets to the Officers' Training School.

I might say that the procedure arranged between the Os. C. 1st and 2nd Battalions and myself was that each month five cadets would be sent to Training Schools, and these cadets be chosen alternatively from desirable men from the 1st and 2nd Battalions. This, you will appreciate, gives a chance to the members of each Battalion equally. Owing to the large number of recruits recently sent across, quite a number of Officers will be required.
