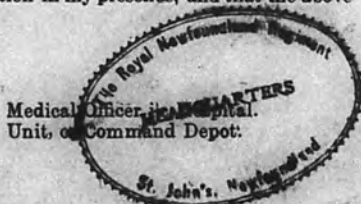

In reply to your letter of Sept. 17th. I have to inform you that the rank, Private, inscribed on your medals is correct. The War Office regulations governing the issue of the British War and Victory Medals reads as follows:- 'Individuals entitled to the British War Medal only the same will be inscribed with the highest rank whether substantive, acting or temporary, held while Overseas. Individuals entitled to the British War and Victory Medals the same will be inscribed with the highest rank whether substantive, acting or temporary, held for any period whatever in a theatre of war, unless reverted for misconduct. The issue of the above medals is only applicable between the 5th. August, 1914, and the 11th. November, 1918'.

On referring to your Record of Service I find that you were appointed Acting Corporal 16/1/19.
