Sir:-

at London about 3.30 pm. on the 8.4.15
I was detailed to proceed to Lavender
Hill Police Station, to investigate the
charge against Pli Lee for overstaying
pass. I found prisoners detained at
Lavender Hill Police Station London.

The police had previously taken
a pass from him dated 30/2/15 to
24/4/15 made out in pli Lee's name.
The pass had apparently ~~been~~ altered.

This pass I took possession of &
I brought it to N. 2. 7 reported to
officer commanding.

On the morning of 9.4.15 on
receipt of telephone message ~~received~~
from Police Station I again
proceeded to Lavender Hill &

Corporal J. Jackson, & addressing

him as Jackson, asked if the
letters belonged to him, he with out
hesitation replied they did & Admitted




