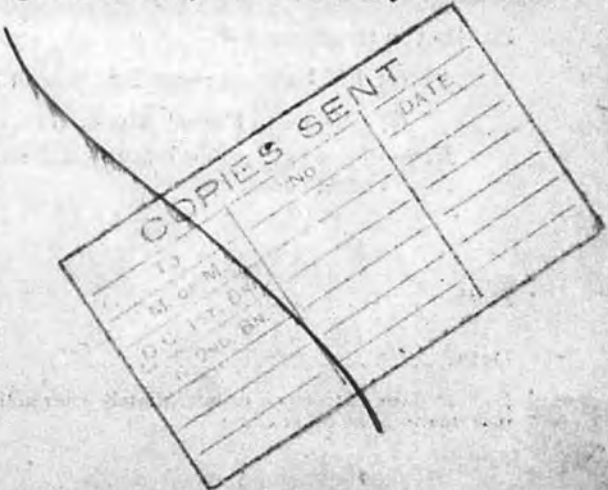





I have been for my Medical Board to-day at Thorpe Road, Norwich, and I have been told that I was discharged from the ^{Royal} Newfoundland Regiment, with Neuresthenia only. I think there has been a mistake in my disability. I was sent from the Somme, France, suffering from Neuresthenia, to Rouen, then to Kings George's Hospital London, then discharged from Convalescence Hospital Putney, going back to the Depot at Ayr. I was sent from Ayr to Edinburgh to take a course of Cookery, while there I contracted Cystitis, I reported

~~to reported~~ to the Medical officer at the Barracks, he gave me medicine and I carried on till I passed my ~~course~~, then going back to Ayr, where I reported to the Medical officer at the depot. He sent me at once to the Royal Scots Barracks Hospital, Ayr, where I was in bed for several months, having my bladder washed out, and put on a diet of milk and barley water, for a considerable time. When I was able to get out of bed I had to walk about with walking sticks, and my wife had to help me to get along. I was then sent back from the depot Ayr to Newfoundland, and sent at once to Waterford Hall, Convalescence Home, where I recieved my discharge papers. I was put to bed for a month or so on a diet

of milk and water and
medicine. Dr McPherson was
the medical officer at the time,
and helped me to get the
albumen and pus out of my
body. I was discharged from
Waterford Hall in a weak state,
and went back to work with
my late Employer Hon S. Milley.
After about four months I was
operated on for appendicitis by
Dr Keegan, General Hospital,
St. John's Newfoundland, Peritonitis
setting in. While in the General
Hospital, my wife had to go to
the pension office St. John's to
see about my pension and
the medical officer, Dr Parsons,
said I was discharged with
Neurasthenia, which she disagreed
saying, I was discharged with
Cystitis, Dr Parsons looked my
Record up, and said she was

quite right, I was discharged
with Cystitis! I have been
Boarded now for over 7 years
and I thought that point had
been put right when my wife
saw the Medical officer, ~~Dr~~ Parsons
at St. John's. This trouble has
been affecting me lately and
when I mentioned it at to-days
Board they said I could not
claim for Cystitis. I think there
has been a slight mistake in
my records at St. John's.
