The nature of the casualty is required for telegraphing details overseas. If the details given are insufficient, reference back to the hospital for further information is rendered necessary. The following instructions should therefore be carefully followed in all Colonial cases:

(a) In the case of sickness, the nature and degree should be stated, e.g. enteric, slight.

(b) In the case of wounds, the nature of the wound, the part of the body affected, and the severity of the injury should be stated, e.g. gunshot, skull, severe.

If a limb has been amputated the fact should be recorded.

NOTE.—These rolls should be forwarded direct to the War Office, Alexandra House, Kingsway, W.C., not later than the day after admission; envelopes to be marked C. 2, Casualties; rolls are not to be telegraphed in advance. The duplicate of the rolls should be sent to the Officer in charge of Records of the Colonial Contingent concerned.

Admissions to the outlying sections of the hospital should be shown separately. If the distance of these sections should render it impossible to forward the rolls the day after the admissions, the sections should be instructed to send lists (on these Army Forms) direct to the War Office, and to the Colonial Contingent Record Office concerned.

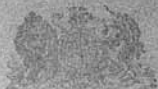



It is with regret and, after due consideration, that I feel obliged to bring to your notice the conduct of one of your officers (C. S. James) conduct unbecoming in officer and a gentleman.

Last fall this man came on the coast recruiting with other soldiers, some of whom were stationed at Harbor Breech. We took pleasure in entertaining these chaps feeling that we couldn't do enough for returned wounded soldiers. Lieut James was not here for some time after the others came but

We left St Johns May 6<sup>th</sup> for home and on  
arriving May 9<sup>th</sup> Thursday the following were  
awaited us, not from James but a friend.

"Since you folks left, a serious situation has  
arisen which compels James cancel future  
or any future arrangement, letter fully  
explaining & follow it.  
You can imagine the shock this was to  
us, we could not think what could have  
possibly happened, so wired this friend  
for more details, and only got an answer  
on Monday 13<sup>th</sup> saying "James married  
Saturday" also a wire from James himself  
saying the exact words as the wire  
I received Thursday the 9<sup>th</sup>.

You will readily understand from my daughter  
has taken this, she was very ill at first,  
we all felt it very keenly, but felt his  
letter would explain some what, but  
letter <sup>did not</sup> come. We saw however in the  
papers an account of this marriage headed  
"Was Wedding" with all the usual details  
May 30<sup>th</sup> I wired James asking why no

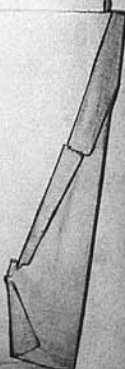

Sir,

With regard to "Blue Puttee Leave."

In connection with the above matter, I have the honour to respectfully submit the following information, and to sincerely trust that this data will assure me a claim for consideration.

I enlisted in August, 1914; was with the Regiment until April 14<sup>th</sup>, 1917, when I was wounded and evacuated from that area to London, England, where, after treatment, I was granted three months convalescence, and, in accordance with the usual procedure, at that time prevailing, applied via War Office, and came home to Newfoundland. I arrived home in due course, reported to the S.O.C., and almost immediately was out on recruiting duty, which apparently, was so satisfactory, that Major Montogomeric, S.O.C., asked me, that if he applied for permission to retain me here, would I again visit

other areas on the South West coast and various sections. Having spent four months on that service, I returned to the City; conducted a draft to Winchester; then came back to Newfoundland; conducted another draft; acted as Adjutant for two months at the Depot; conducted a draft to Winchester, and from that area I proceed to France, where I remained on active Service until the closing of the usual arrangements, following the Armistice.

Some time later, there was granted to those members of the "Blue Puttees," who did not accept their leave (and quite a few did not) an amount, in lieu of their allowances, according to rank in the Regiment.

In my opinion, which I respectfully submit, convalescent leave granted me was not "Blue Puttee Leave," because, although convalescent, to all appearances, I feel, and believe, that I was on real active Services, a duty which I willingly performed, notwithstanding my disability contracted on active work overseas.

I feel sure that you will see the justice of my claim, and will



arrange for the matter to be conveyed  
to the proper authorities. I have little  
complaint to make-- I am not asking  
for any special consideration, but I do  
trust that it is not the desire of any  
Department, or of any Administration to  
fail to see that the reasonable claims  
of the ex-Servicemen are not fairly, and  
reasonably, dealt with.
