

I have had an interview with this man to try and dispose of his somewhat complicated affairs. He now thinks the best thing to be done is to allow his allowance to continue to his children in Newfoundland but to reduce it from 70¢ to 50¢ (which will be done by his Company Commander) This will leave him about £3. a month which he can give over if he wishes, as he offers to do, to the woman he now proposes to marry. 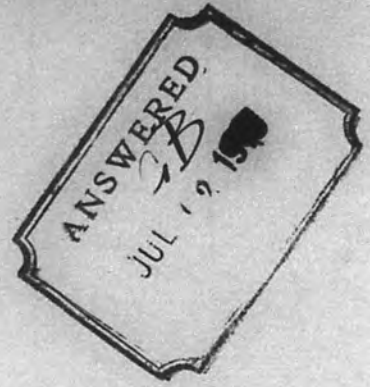

He quite clearly understand that his first duty is to his ~~children~~ dependent children, and the Ministry of Militia would not sanction an allowance to any other party whilst they were unprovided for. He is as a carpenter in receipt of about £2. per month extra duty pay which should be enough for his own private needs.

As a special case and in view of the statement in your reply to this Office No. 6773/522, 2/5/18, this man is employed as Carpenter and receives (from Regimental Funds?) Working Pay of about £2.0.0. per month.

It is suggested that the following arrangement may be made,-
His former allotment of 70 cents per day and Separation Allowance be continued to his children up to the date preceding his marriage.

MINUTES OF CORRESPONDENCE.

From the date of marriage, allotment of 50 cents per day and half the Separation Allowance to be paid to his children in Newfoundland. Similar allotment and half the Separation Allowance to be paid to his wife in United Kingdom.

Claim for half Separation Allowance in favour of children should be prepared on N.F.P./82 indicating appointment of guardian for his Children, and similar claim in favour of his wife on N.F.P/82 & 84, supported by allotment forms.

The foregoing is of course subject to your approval, and it may be Janes desire to adhere to the arrangement at present in force, i.e., Allotment of 50 cents per day and full Separation Allowance to be paid to his children in Newfoundland. Provision for his wife to be made from the remainder of his Pay.

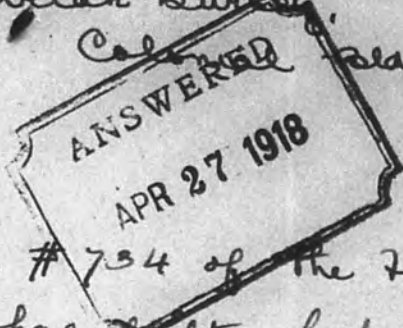

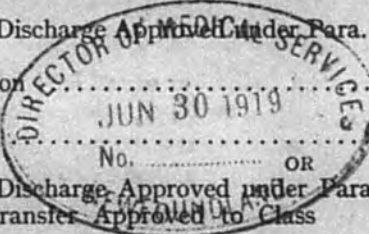

With reference to the enclosed ~~or somewhat~~ "Confidential" memorandum from O.C. "F" Company, 29/4/18 (3888), reference may be made to Regulations Governing the grant of Separation Allowance, Para. 14, which indicates the admissability of the claim. It should however be borne in mind by the Soldier that Separation Allowance may already be issuable to his dependants in Newfoundland, and before any claim in respect of his wife in United Kingdom (should he marry) could be admitted, the matter would require to be submitted to the Minister of Militia for his consideration. Meanwhile no action has been taken pending your reply and receipt of the Soldier's claim.

I have had an interview with this man to try and dispose of his ~~some~~ complicated affairs. ~~He now~~ thinks the best thing to be done is to allow his allowance to continue to his children in Newfoundland but to reduce it from 70¢ to 50¢ (which will be done by his Company Commander). This will leave him about £3. a month which he can give over if he wishes, as he offers to do, to the woman he now proposes to marry. He quite clearly understands that his first duty is to his dependent children, and the Ministry of Militia would not sanction an allowance to any other party whilst they were unprovided for. He is as a carpenter in receipt of about £2 per month extra duty pay which should be enough for his own private needs.

It is not known in this Office whether the former allotment of 70¢ per day in favour of the Soldier's wife, now deceased, is being continued to his children, but it is presumed that this course would be taken by Headquarters on the decease of their Mother. If such action has been taken, possibly a request to have such confirmed may be on the way, please.

With reference to the enclosed copy of "Confidential" memorandum, from O.C. "P" Company, 29/4/18, (3888), reference may be made to Regulations Governing the grant of Separation Allowance, Para. 14, which indicates the admissibility of the Claim. It should however be borne in mind by the Soldier that Separation Allowance may already be issuable to his dependents in Newfoundland, and before any claim in respect of his wife in United Kingdom (should he marry) could be admitted, the matter would require to be submitted to the Minister of Militia for his consideration. Meanwhile no action has taken pending your reply and receipt of the Soldier's claim.

It is not known in this Office whether the former allotment of 70s per day in favor of the Soldier's wife, now deceased, is being continued to his children, but it is presumed that this course would be taken by Headquarters on the decease of their Mother. If such action has been taken, possibly a request to have such confirmed may be on the way, please.

I have had an interview with this man to try and dispose of his somewhat complicated affairs. He now thinks the best thing to be done is to allow his allowance to continue to his children in Newfoundland but to reduce it from 70s to 50s (which will be done by his Company Commander) this will leave him about £3. a month which he can give over if he wishes, as he offers to do, to the woman he now proposes to marry. He quite clearly understand that his first duty is to his ~~children~~ dependent children, and the Ministry of Militia would not sanction an allowance to any other party whilst they were unprovided for. He is as a carpenter in receipt of about £2. per month extra duty pay which should be enough for his own private needs.
