

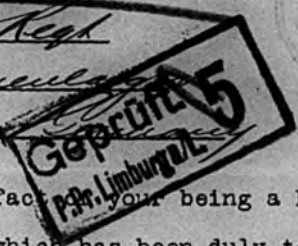

Notification of the fact of your being a Prisoner of War has been received, and which has been duly telegraphed to Newfoundland.

The Newfoundland War Contingent Association have also been notified by this Office, and will communicate with you direct with regard to food, arrangements of which are undertaken by them.

So far a direct notification from you has not been received, as in the case of other Prisoners of War, and which usually includes a request for clothing, with particulars of sizes, etc., especially as to boots: meanwhile with a view to avoiding what may entail considerable delay in your receiving supplies, this Office is drawing and transmitting to you through the Central Prisoners of War Committee, a first issue of clothing, based upon sizes implied by information stated in your attestation.

Any change of your address should be notified to this Office, which in turn will be transmitted to Newfoundland, and to the Newfoundland War Contingent Association.

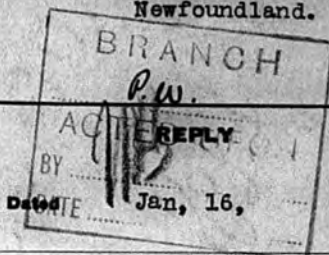

STATEMENT OF PRISONER OF WAR

#2450, Pte. Ed. Janes - Trillingate

Enlisted April 1916. Proceeded Overseas - July 1916

Company in France - "B" Company

Place & Date of Capture - Monchy-le-Preux, April 14th, 1917

Circumstances of Capture - When the Germans broke through on our left we were soon surrounded on all sides, and as we had no ammunition left, we were taken prisoners.

Details of Life & Treatment under capture - After a few days at Douai and Fort-McDonald, Lille I was sent to Marquion behind the German Lines for 3 days, after which I was moved to Avencourt for about 2½ months. We had a pretty hard time of it here as we were forced to work from early morning till dusk with practically nothing to eat. The German guards were always driving us with the aid of a stick or a rifle butt. They gave us very little water to drink and none at all to wash with; and we were without greatcoats or blankets. Then I was shifted to Bouschenes for about 4 months working on an ammunition dump. The treatment here was about the same. I only got two ~~pink~~ parcels at this place, and I was told that all our other parcels were held up at Desnain and would not be issued to us. My next move was to Schneidemuhl in Germany on December 8th, 1917 for 8 days and from there to Altdamm for another 8 days and then we were sent out on working parties to Elmenhorst cutting wood. It was bitterly cold there and for the first four weeks we had no blankets, and slept in the straw without any fire or heat of any kind just as we were. At first, too, the food was very bad and we were nearly starved, but the arrival of the Red Cross food parcels improved our condition greatly, and I am sure they saved our lives. After 8 months in this place I was sent to Vietlapp for 4 months and was there when the armistice was signed. I was working on a farm and the treatment was much better, for we had no guard and the farmer we worked for was quite decent to us. I was repatriated via Denmark and arrived in Hull on December 15th, 1918.



With reference to your letter of March 9th enclosing \$5.00 forwarded by Capt. James Janes, father of No. 2450, Private E.A. Janes, prisoner of war, I am directed to inform you that a regulation existed by order of the War Office that money forwarded by individuals to the N.W.C.A. for food parcels for prisoners of war could not be accepted. To make sure that this regulation was still in effect, a cable was despatched to the Record Office, London making an enquiry. A reply has been received only to-day stating that money forwarded to the Association by individuals for parcels of food could not be accepted for this purpose. It is regretted, therefore, that Capt. Janes' wish cannot be acceded to, and the \$5.00 is returned herewith (B. of M. note 601783, \$5.00)

It is presumed that Capt. Janes understands that 3 food parcels, each weighing 11 lbs., are forwarded to every prisoner of war every two weeks, and clothing parcels at stated periods.

Sir:-

Your letter of Nov., 6, has been received with enclosed letters, (1) from Pte. James to Mrs. James (2) from Mrs Pike to Mrs James, (3) from Canadian Red Cross to Mrs Pike and also the sum of \$5.20. I am instructed to say that Mrs. James is apparently misunderstanding the letters from the Canadian Red Cross and Mrs Pike. It is understood that money may be sent to the Canadian Red Cross Society London where it is used for purchasing of food parcels for prisoners of war in Germany. The arrangements as far as Hfld. prisoners of war is concerned is as follows:- as the Prisoner of War has been officially notified through the War Office, the Pay & Record Office instructions are issued to the Newfoundland War Contingent War Association giving the address of the soldier concerned, parcels will then be packed and despatched by the N.W.C.A to the Central Prisoner of War Committee. (an Authorized Association under War Office to handle with parcels for Prisoners of War), these parcels contain, Tinned Beef, tinned Salmon, Biscuits, Milk, Sugar, Chocolate, Cigarettes, Tobacco, Carbolic Soap, Toilet Necessaries, as well as Clothes and under Clothing, Boots, Cap and Towels and also a great Coat, parcels are sent to Prisoners of War at the rate of three parcels per fortnight for every soldier

The N.W.C.A. has taken great pains to despatch parcels regularly and it is understood that the C.P.O.W. Committee is strictly attentive to its duties. Some delay has been experienced in view of the fact that Prisoners of War are moved about from one camp to another at least one month sometimes three months have elapsed before a registered address of a Prisoner of War has been received in London.

The soldier is not aware of this and is inclined to believe that he is neglected the result is that letters are written to relatives complaining that no parcels have been received. I may say for your information that we have had the very latest instructions from the C.P.O.W. Committee dated Sept., 1917, which states that there is no new departure from ruling governing the sending of parcels to Prisoners of War and if there is any confusion it must be owing to the fact that the Canadian Authorities were publishing an advertisement referring as Officers Parcel Scheme which was to come into force on Aug. 1st., and has since been postponed until Nov., 1st.,

As regards as to sending of money to Prisoners of War maxim amount which might be sent is £10 per month at the rate of \$2.6. weekly, the amount which you have sent - \$5.20 will be forwarded by cable with instructions to forward same to Pte. James according to regulations.

I must apologize for taking up so much of your time and my excuse is that I am strictly aware of you influential

position and your interest in Regimental affairs generally.

If you are in possession of facts which closely concerns most of our people you would be in a position to lessen to a larger extent the anxiety which must be felt by people who have relatives Prisoner of War in Germany.

I omitted to say that parcels sent by private people cannot be delivered and is therefore a waste of money to the sender, this is a very strict regulation of the Central Prisoner of War Committee. Letters returned herewith.

Having seen by the Twillingate Sun, that your son Allan is a prisoner of War in Germany, and that he has written and asked for food, and knowing by experience, the heart ache that that plea will cost you, I am taking the liberty to write you and give you the address of the Canadian Red Cross. Of course you may already have made your arrangements, but if not; I am sure you will be glad of a little information. It took me weeks to find out what to do, when I first heard from my son, who has been a prisoner now for a year and a half, of course as you any know, we were able to send parcels to Germany then, but when that was not allowed any more, we could only be sure of him being fed, through the Canadian Red Cross in England, to whom I am sending an order for five dollars ever month. I am sending you one of the letters which they sent me, the correct address is:-

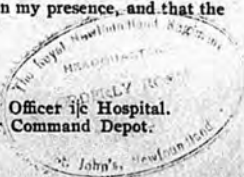
