I would be glad if you would refer the case of the above mentioned Officer to the War Office for favour of ruling.

This matter was submitted to the War Office and reply received as follows:-

When the 1st Battalion was ordered to Gallipoli, Lieut. James, who was then No. 109 Orderly Room Sergt. H.C. James, was ordered to remain at Alexandria with H.Q. 3rd Echelon, and he is the only member of the Regiment who was on duty under the terms of the Regulations governing the award of the 1914-1915 Star, who is apparently not eligible. I should be glad if you would press his claim to the utmost.



Sir,

Permit me to bring to your notice a matter which seems to me to be a great injustice.

I enlisted with the first 500 men and have been on Active Service with the Regiment without a break since Aug. 20th., 1915. I was appointed Orderly Room Sergeant on Sept. 13th., 1915 and in such capacity was attached to General Headquarters, 3rd. Echelon, in Egypt until March 17th., 1916, when I embarked for France, and was attached to the Headquarters Staff at Rouen until Oct. 3rd., 1917, when authority was granted by the 1st. Echelon, Sir Douglas Haig's Headquarters, for me to return to Newfoundland on furlough for a period of two months. My work both in Egypt and France was- 'Responsible for the Record of Service of the Men and the general clerical work of the Battalion'. My pay was \$2.85 per diem which included a Subsistence Allowance of \$1.00 per diem. The unjust part of it is that Major Timewell reduced my pay to \$1.70 with effect from the date of leaving my duties, Oct. 3rd., 1917. Permit me to say that this is the first case in which a Sergeant who served more than two years in the Field without promotion and, by the way, the only Non-commissioned Officer on Service who was not considered at all and I know, for that was my work to keep the Records of the Battalion, had his pay reduced while on furlough. True, while in London prior to sailing for home, Major Timewell said to me that he was writing the Minister of Militia regarding my pay which was to be left to his discretion. I do not know what has been done in this matter but would feel grateful if my old rate of pay was continued,

Re Promotion. Possibly it was an oversight of the Commanding Officer as I was detached from my Battalion but nevertheless, I held an important position being the only representative of the Newfoundland Regiment on the General Headquarters Staff.

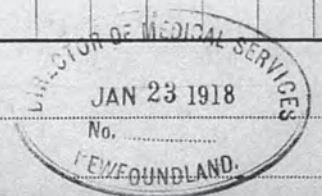

F., which latter, it may be assumed has been written as relating to a N.C.O. of an Imperial Unit: I have the honour to state that as customary with Officers and Men proceeding to Newfoundland Janes' account has been closed in this office as at date of embarkation, 10/10/17..

With the Canadians it is the custom unless a Soldier actually remains on the strength of the 3rd. Echelon for him to revert to regimental rates of pay and allowances from date of detachment, and if this is followed Janes should thereafter be credited with the pay of an Orderly Room Sergeant:

With regard to subsistence allowance: The rates payable (2/- consolidated) to N. C. O's and Men on sick furlough ex. Hospital, and 1/9 (ration allowance only) to those on ordinary furlough, should be borne in mind; see Circular Letters attached, also my letter No. 4670/205, 6/11/16, to H. E. the Governor. The above rates however apply to Men whilst in this Country; the rate whilst in Newfoundland is understood to be otherwise.

As a tentative measure and pending a ruling on the subject, which is now asked for, the case has been dealt with as reflected in copy of non-effective a/c enclosed.

Whilst attached to the 3rd. Echelon, the following was his rate of pay and allowances:

in addition to which he was entitled to draw rations through Imperial sources and also to accomodation.

It should be especially mentioned, that although rations and accomodation at the Base are provided by the Imperial

authorities, one man cannot do much with a regular ration in kind, and the equivalent in cash, even if obtainable does not go far; and considering Janes' state of health in the past special consideration was given and full daily subsistence without deduction was granted, it being understood that he did not thereafter draw rations in kind, or in cash, and also made his own arrangements for accomodation.

With regard to travelling expenses: It is understood that he had free conduct to London, and pending a decision on the subject of Officers and Men proceeding on leave and furlough to Newfoundland, see my letters Nos. 6419/17, 29/8/17, to the Hon. Secretary of the Finance Committee and 10080/44, 1/10/17, to you, his passage has been paid as in the case of Capt. Nangle, such being recoverable if so decided.

It is asked that you may be good enough to review all the aspects of this case and instruct this office accordingly, when a Circular Letter governing this, and similar cases can be issued.

When Janes returns it is also asked that a precise statement of his account may be sent so as to reach this office about the time he returns here, in order that such may be continued without any difficulty or further reference to Headquarters.

With reference to enclosed copy of this office memorandum No. 10407/8, 9/10/17, and that from the Adjutant General, G. H. Q., B. E. F., which latter, it may be assumed has been written as relating to a N.C.O. of an Imperial Unit; I have the honour to state that as customary with Officers and Men proceeding to Newfoundland Janes' account has been closed in this office as at date of embarkation, 10/10/17.

With the Canadian it is the custom unless a Soldier actually remains on the strength of the 3rd. Echelon for him to revert to regimental rates of pay and allowances from date of detachment, and if this is followed Janes should thereafter be credited with the pay of an Orderly Room Sergeant:

With regard to subsistence allowance: The rates payable (2/- consolidated) to N. C. O's and Men on sick furlough ex. Hospital, and 1/9 (ration allowance only) to those on ordinary furlough, should be borne in mind; see Circular Letters attached, also my letter No. 4670/205, 6/11/16, to H. E. the Governor. The above rates however apply to Men whilst in this Country; the rate whilst in Newfoundland is understood to be otherwise.

As a tentative measure and pending a ruling on the subject, which is now asked for, the case has been dealt with as reflected in copy of non-effective a/c enclosed.

Whilst attached to the 3rd. Echelon, the following was his rate of pay and allowances:

in addition to which he was entitled to draw rations through Imperial sources and also to accommodation.

It should be especially mentioned, that although rations and accommodation at the Base are provided by the Imperial

authorities, one man cannot do much with a regular ration in kind, and the equivalent in cash, even if obtainable does not go far; and considering Janes' state of health in the past special consideration was given and full daily subsistence without deduction was granted, it being understood that he did not thereafter draw rations in kind, or in cash, and also made his own arrangements for accomodation.

With regard to travelling expenses: It is understood that he had free conduct to London, and pending a decision on the subject of Officers and Men proceeding on leave and furlough to Newfoundland, see my letters Nos. 6419/17, 29/6/17, to the Hon. Secretary of the Finance Committee and 10080/44, 1/10/17, to you, his passage has been paid as in the case of Capt. Nangle, such being recoverable if so decided.



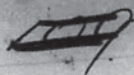



Dear Mr. Janes,

Yesterday I received your letter: I enclose envelope for your information. This among a number of others has come back from the Mediterranean, to where for some inexplicable reason it was apparently sent in spite of the address being perfectly clear and sufficient.

The letter you enclosed was mailed to your son yesterday, with a request for acknowledgement and when I hear from him I will again communicate with you.

I am obliged to you for the cutting from the newspaper.

I have had a number of similar cases of letters addressed to this Office, official and otherwise, being sent out to the Mediterranean and returned, and at the present time I know there are still a number undelivered.

It would appear that this Office is constantly getting the blame for what it must be clear it has no control over. Letters and parcels received here are remailed to the last known whereabouts of the addressee. After that the process goes into other hands. I may say that these constantly recurring cases have formed the subject of a great deal of investigation and reports to H.E. the Governor, which by this time have probably had some publicity.

I am much at a loss to understand the relation between the "Command Paymaster, Rouen", and "Ourselves". It is customary for the Regular Infantry Section (to which we are attached) to send the Command Paymaster an extract from Daily Orders Part II, relating to ~~the~~ Officers arrivals, casualties, etc. and we have been instructed to do likewise.

Again, one day last week, an Officer came to me from the 'Deceased Effects' Dept. and inquired who was our Command Paymaster here. I told him we have only the one Paymaster who is in London. He appeared to have lost his patience with such a reply and told me it was about time I knew more about my business. I afterwards learned that he had some 35 francs, the effects of No. 177, Sergt. A. Manning, and he had sent it in error to the Canadian Paymaster here. However, I would feel greatly indebted to you if you would kindly explain to me our relation to the Command Paymaster, and if he is acting as intermediate between the Battalion in the Field and Headquarters, London. I understand the Pay for Dewling and myself is drawn through the C. P.

My dear Hughie,

It seems that I too have acquired the habit of making profuse apologies for the delay in personal correspondence, but it is not difficult for you ~~to~~<sup>to</sup> fathom the why and the wherefore.

Many thanks for the address of Miss Bianco and Miss Dickenson but up to the present I have not written either of them.

Well, I have a hundred and one questions to ask you and I only hope that I won't forget the half of them.

- 1) You will remember about that awful blunder the Battery made over 2445, Hallett, rep. K. in A. Please let me have the B.103 for this man forwarded to you with the 2090(a). (I have made out a Temp. one for the time being).
- 2) Here's another damn thing that has cropped up. 1421, Gosse, U. arrived at the Depot with a draft from No. 263.17. The story goes that on the arrival of the draft, they were asked if there were any blacksmiths amongst them, and this fellow Gosse (B. 4.) showed himself up as having that trade. Well, he was retained there until the 26.6.17 when he was transferred (temporary or otherwise, I don't know) to the 2nd. A. S. B. Repair Shop, Rouen. So now you please tell me if this is in order, for I am of opinion that if this is permitted with our men then they can <sup>find</sup> draw from 35 to 40 % first or second class mechanics amongst them. And then, we have the fisherman who can turn his hand to almost ~~to~~ any trade and make good. I contend

that being colonials and enlisted voluntary we ought to be permitted to entirely control our own men and as you know, we have the greatest difficulty to keep our front line up to strength. Let me have your opinion and also please interview the Major on the subject and if you agree with me I will make claim for him through the proper channels.

3) Say, what has happened to 452. pte. W. Hall who proceeded on furlough to Newfoundland about a year ago? Is he discharged?

4) Re A.F. B 7069. Do you wish them to be forwarded to you or shall I retain the bunch until the duration? Those of Gallipoli are also in my possession.

5) Here's another hot question of the moment. Quite a number of circulars have been passed around recently regarding N.C.O.'s promotions, reversion of those holding acting ranks when leaving the front line sick or wounded, etc. etc. etc. Keeping the b.d. <sup>to</sup> within the number of the authorized establishment, etc. What I am anxious to know is - are we to keep to the War Establishment, or is it left to the discretion of the b.d. whether he promotes over and above the number allowed? Also, knowing that the Depot is always in need of N.C.O.'s with first hand knowledge of actual warfare, is it advisable to reduce them on evacuating the Batta. in the field & invalided to England? I believe this question is merely a matter of pay with Imperial Troops but I think we really have a double demand for Instructors, our Home Depot and Newfoundland.

I am still making extensive enquiries about 2758 Kennedy but up to the present have been unsuccessful.

in locating him.

About a fortnight ago I got quite a surprise when I was informed by an orderly that there was a little nurse at the door to see me.

It appears that you gave ~~the~~ Nurse Bluett my address and I suppose I must thank you for it as otherwise I should not have known that there were any Newfoundland girls within a couple of thousand miles of me. I have since had two nice promenades with her. (Of course, it's business before pleasure every time, here).

Oh say, Nurse Bluett has demanded my collar badges and said that you promised the other four girls and herself collar badges but that you never sent them. So, watch yourself, for they seek revenge some day! I would be much obliged if you would send me half a dozen (libre preferable) badges and have them charged to my account.

I noticed in this morning's paper that the Canadian Conscription Bill has passed its third reading and no doubt it will receive the same favour in the Upper House. When is Newfoundland going to pick up the 'musical strain'? I think it would have been a hang sight better for us if the Forestry Batta. could be turned into Infantrymen. How long do you think we can hold out with reinforcements? What is the strength of the new Battalion?

I note your remarks re the 21 days delay before reporting men as 'Missing' but officers are rushed through. Well, all I can say is that before such procedure could be altered an agitation would have to come from the other side of the 'heering pond'. Nevertheless, there is

a lot of common sense in such a delay and I think  
our casualties of April afford a very good example. Had  
there been no delay it would have meant some 60 corrections  
'Prisoners of war' and about 30 more K. in Action.

O.K., by the way, you were going to keep me advised as  
to the movements of our 'aerial fleet' but nothing to hand yet.  
I saw in the Daily Mail a few days ago that Steve Green has been  
K. in A. ~~And~~ yet another chum gone west.

I have the good news to tell you that I have now  
moved into a new section amongst gentlemen and no one  
knows what difficulties I have had to contend with, in the  
former sub-section for the past three months. During that  
time I was before the Colonel ~~In~~ on the three different  
occasions with serious charges - 1) Refusing to obey an  
order (a Court-Martial charge in itself; 2) Destroying  
an official document; 3) Insolence to a Warrant Officer.  
Well, to put a long story short I was acquitted on  
all three charges thanks to a really fine old gentleman.  
I will say nothing of that Serjt. Major nor the Sub-section  
officer as their actions speak louder than words.

I do not know that I have said I intended to  
but let it suffice for this time. Just a word before  
closing. My new Officer and Serjt. Major and real  
gentlemen and I can foresee much peace and goodwill  
provided another shift does not take place.

Let me have an early reply to my queries if at

Dear Janes:

I received yours of the 26/7/17 two or three days ago, when I got back from my Summer Leave, and incidentally honeymoon. In consequence of an accumulation of matters, I find time only now to answer your many questions.

(1) Herewith A.F. B.103 for 2445 Hollett, copy of which had been sent to H.Q. prior to the grievous error being discovered

(2) The case of 1421 Gosse, I understand from you, is a "washout", as he has since gone up the line. Nevertheless it raises an interesting point, which the Major has written to the 3rd Echelon about from evidence we already had in this Office, that some of our men were being collared by the Imperial authorities. The Major to begin with has merely asked for the names of those borrowed.

(3) 352 Hall is still at the Depot, having overstayed his leave some 9 months, due to no fault of his own. The Officer i/c Records here wore out many a nib trying to have the correct thing done, without avail.

(4) The vexed and knotty question of keeping the number of W.O's and N.C.O's down to the Establishment is one that the Major and I, to say nothing of the Asst. Paymaster, have been hammering at for a long time. An instruction has now been almost completed, embodying many A.C.I's etc. and adapted to this ~~to this~~ Contingent, which ought to clear up the matter and put it on a sounder footing than it is at present.

(5) I hope you have located 2758 Kennedy. For the love of peace don't report him "Missing, 14/4/17". We have no trace here.

(6) Glad you are doing your duty by Nurse Cluett, and taking her walks, etc.

(7) I have no recollection of promising badges to the four

(2)

nurses you mention. I am sending six badges to you under separate cover.

(8) The Canadian Conscription Bill, although passed, I understand is meeting with considerable opposition in the province of Quebec, and has not yet been put into operation. I don't think we'll ever get it in Newfoundland.

Newfoundland has now got a Coalition Government. Three of the old Executive went out, and six new members of the Opposition have taken seats, making a total Executive Council of twelve. The new Ministry includes Dr. Lloyd, and Coaker (Colonial Secretary). I hear Bennett is Minister of Militia, and either Crosbie or Piccott of Munitions! Whether these last three are true I don't know, having heard only from rumour, but I do know there is a Department of Militia, and not before its time. Morris is still Premier.

I note your remarks anent the "Missing". 21 days would appear to be necessary to retain the list if so many discrepancies have to be corrected.

I have sent you all the movements of Flying Officers to date, and I imagine you would have been informed by someone in France that Stan. Green "went West".

We have 140 Prisoners in Germany (alive), and in addition 9 others died. You have been informed of all of these. As these are struck off your strength it would not appear necessary to send these names (P. of W) to you, except for your personal information.

It keeps us additionally busy here looking after the 140 Prisoners, all of whom have to be clothed and fed from London.

There are some 250 recruits in Nfld for the Regt., and 200 Foresters. How we are going to keep up to strength I don't know.

I hope you are happier under the new régime.

With reference to enclosed copy of this office memorandum No. 10407/8, 9/10/17, and that from the Adjutant General, G. H. Q., B. E. F., which latter, it may be assumed has been written as relating to an N.C.O. of an Imperial Unit: I have the honour to state that as customary with Officers and Men proceeding to Newfoundland Janes' account has been closed in this office as at date of embarkation, 10/10/17.

With the Canadian it is the custom unless a Soldier actually remains on the strength of the 3rd. Echelon for him to revert to regimental rates of pay and allowances from date of detachment, and if this is followed Janes should thereafter be credited with the pay of an Orderly Room Sergeant:

With regard to subsistence allowance: The rates payable (2/- consolidated) to N. C. O's and Men on sick furlough ex. Hospital, and 1/9 (ration allowance only) to those on ordinary furlough, should be borne in mind; see Circular Letters attached, also my letter No. 4670/205, 6/11/16, to H. E. the Governor. The above rates however apply to Men whilst in this Country; the rate whilst in Newfoundland is understood to be otherwise.

As a tentative measure and pending a ruling on the subject, which is now asked for, the case has been dealt with as reflected in copy of non-effective a/c enclosed.

Whilst attached to the 3rd. Echelon, the following was his rate of pay and allowances:

in addition to which he was entitled to draw rations through Imperial sources and also to accomodation.

It should be especially mentioned, that although rations and accomodation at the Base are provided by the Imperial

authorities, one man cannot do much with a regular ration in kind, and the equivalent in cash, even if obtainable does not go far; and considering Janes' state of health in the past special consideration was given and full daily subsistence without deduction was granted, it being understood that he did not thereafter draw rations in kind, or in cash, and also made his own arrangements for accomodation.

With regard to travelling expenses: It is understood that he had free conduct to London, and pending a decision on the subject of Officers and Men proceeding on leave and furlough to Newfoundland, see my letters Nos. 6419/17, 29/6/17, to the Hon. Secretary of the Finance Committee and 10080/44, 1/10/17, to you, his passage has been paid as in the case of Capt. Hangle, such being recoverable if so decided.

It is asked that you may be good enough to review all the aspects of this case and instruct this office accordingly, when a Circular Letter governing this, and similar cases can be issued.

When Janes returns it is also asked that a precise statement of his account may be sent so as to reach this office about the time he returns here, in order that such may be continued without any difficulty or further reference to Headquarters.


