Opinion of the Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as, in the event of the man being invalidated, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.

(ii.) Expressions such as "may," "might," "probably," &c., should be avoided.

(iii.) The rates of pension vary directly according to whether the disability is attributed to (a) active service, (b) climate, or (c) ordinary military service. It is therefore essential when assigning the cause of the disability to differentiate between them (see Articles 1162 and 1165, Pay Warrant, 1913).

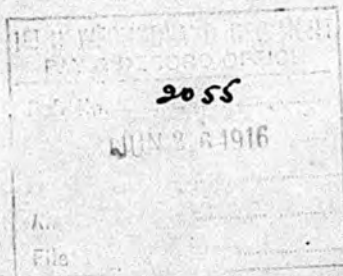

## Opinion of the Medical Board.

NOTES.—(i.) Clear and decisive answers to the following questions are to be carefully filled in by the Board, as in the event of the man being invalided, it is essential that the Commissioners of Chelsea Hospital should be in possession of the most reliable information to enable them to decide upon the man's claim to pension.





May I write you an extract  
from a letter received from Jens Jensen  
regarding discount charged on money  
sent him by Ufld.

"I did not receive any money for ex-  
penses from Feb. 28<sup>th</sup> 1919, until November,  
1919. Then they sent the cheque. Just about  
that time I received from the Militia Dept.  
a War Gratitude Payment of I think \$337.<sup>00</sup>  
something over four months payment.  
I have the figures at hand. It was made

out in monthly pay cheques for I think March, April, May, June (maybe July) anyway I did not receive any of them, till they came together in November. The doctor handed the cheque for expenses and my War Gratitude cheques into the Bank for me the same day. Last night the Custer Bank informed me, that the Clearing House, Bank of Omaha had notified them that the Canadian items, my cheques, were discounted at a rate of 9%, maybe more.

Practically all the payments I received for the whole year went in at the same time, because as I was not sure if they intended paying my expenses, I had to keep my Pension Cheques in case they didn't.

Extract from another letter received a mail later: —

"Five days ago, I received another letter from the Bank telling me they had been charged with further discount on my Cheques. They have charged me 11% discount they charged me \$50 cheques only realising \$44<sup>50</sup> to me. It means over \$90 loss to me, because my War Gratitude cheques, several Pension Cheques that were being held for Sanatorium expenses while waiting for the expenses to be settled, and the Doctor's cheque for expenses, all went in at the same time."

Would you be so kind as to do what you can in this matter? It certainly is a big loss to him. I understand

At the commencement of the War you—very properly—undertook your duties as a citizen and proceeded on active service with the Ambulance Corps; and I much regret to learn that you are now discharged from active service in consequence of injuries which, while incapacitating you from service in the field, will not debar you from resuming your plans to enter the Ministry.

Meanwhile, you placed your savings in the hands of your mother and sisters and consequently have not the resources requisite to meet your expenses in college.

Under these circumstances, I have gladly undertaken to defray half the cost of your training and I hold myself engaged to provide the necessary sums whenever they are needed. I believe that Mr. John Browning has undertaken to provide the other half. I have seen the Revd. Mr. Barton on the subject and shall forward him a copy of this letter.

I shall be glad to know in due course whether you still have any funds available out of your previous savings towards the expenses. I gathered in a conversation with Mr. Barton that, with due application and consideration of your previous training the course in the Theological College may not cost as much as \$700; but I leave the settlement of the cost in the hands of Mr. Barton, merely repeating my engagement to defray in equal shares with Mr. John Browning such sums as may be necessary to enable you to attain your heart's desire.
